


Andrew Ramirez multi-tasks with his iPad, using it to listen to music while working on a homework assignment in the commons area.



















This team continued the echool record of 5 straight playoff appearances.


Ryan Blake and Caleb Careon were named Honorable Mention All-State in the Wichita and Topeka newspapers.

The Tigers beat the Abilene Cowboys for the first time since 2007.




Football Homecoming 2012




Door decorating




What are some good memories you have from this season?



The most personal part of being at the top of tree is getting to choose the song.


Senior Tiger Chorale member Catherine Wichman chose to sing a solo of "Breath of Heaven" which is one of her favorite Christmas songs.










