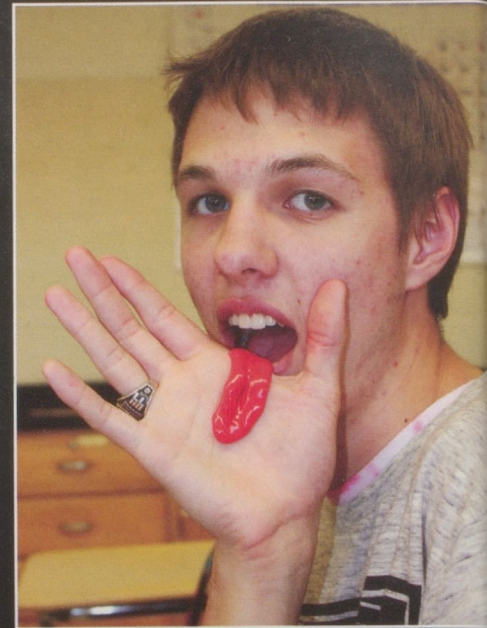

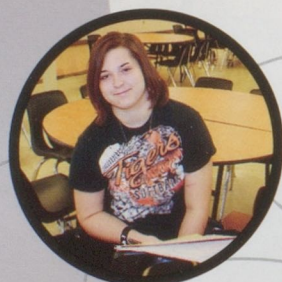

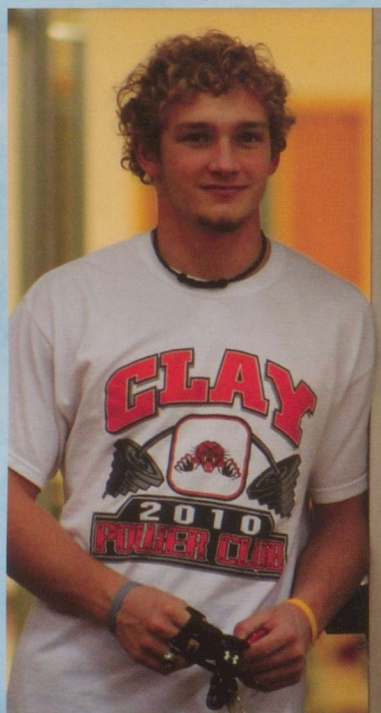

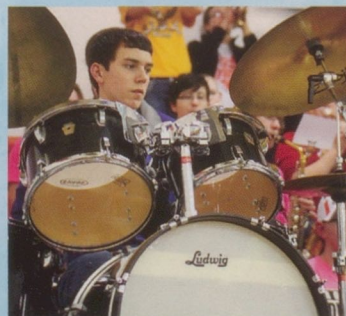

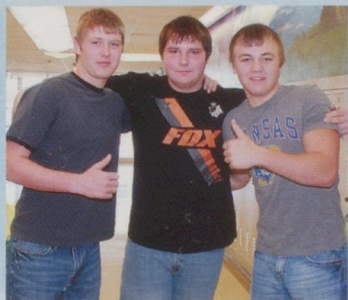

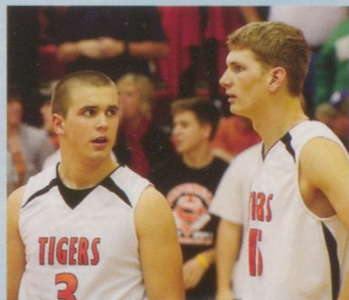

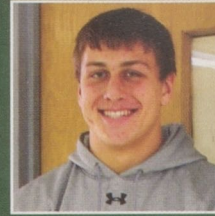
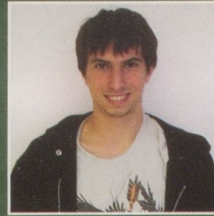


Safety First

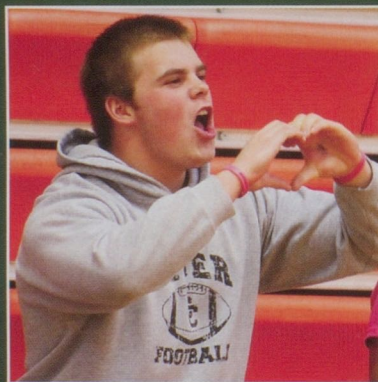

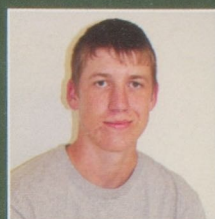

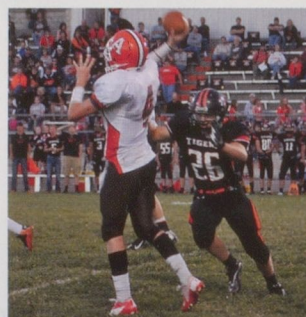

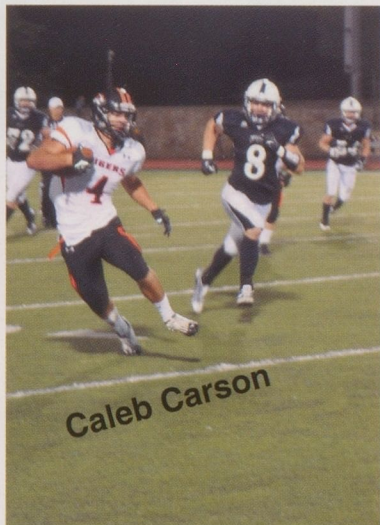


Senior Dalton Haist was a wide receiver and cornerback. Dalton was the leading receiver on the team with 21 receptions.

Their attendants were Tristen Turner, Rett Girton, Bailey Bloom, Ryan Blake, Alyx Bloom and Caleb Carson.

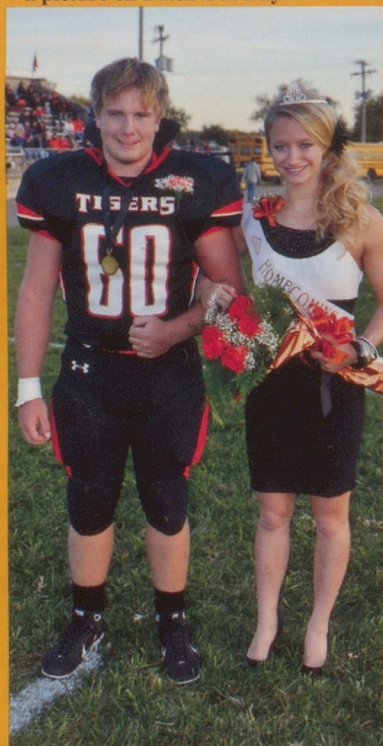

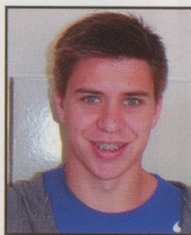


What are some good memories you have from this season?

Seniors Alyx Bloom and Alyssa Kohlman both had solo parts in the song, "Keep on Following the Star" which was sung by Tiger Chorale.

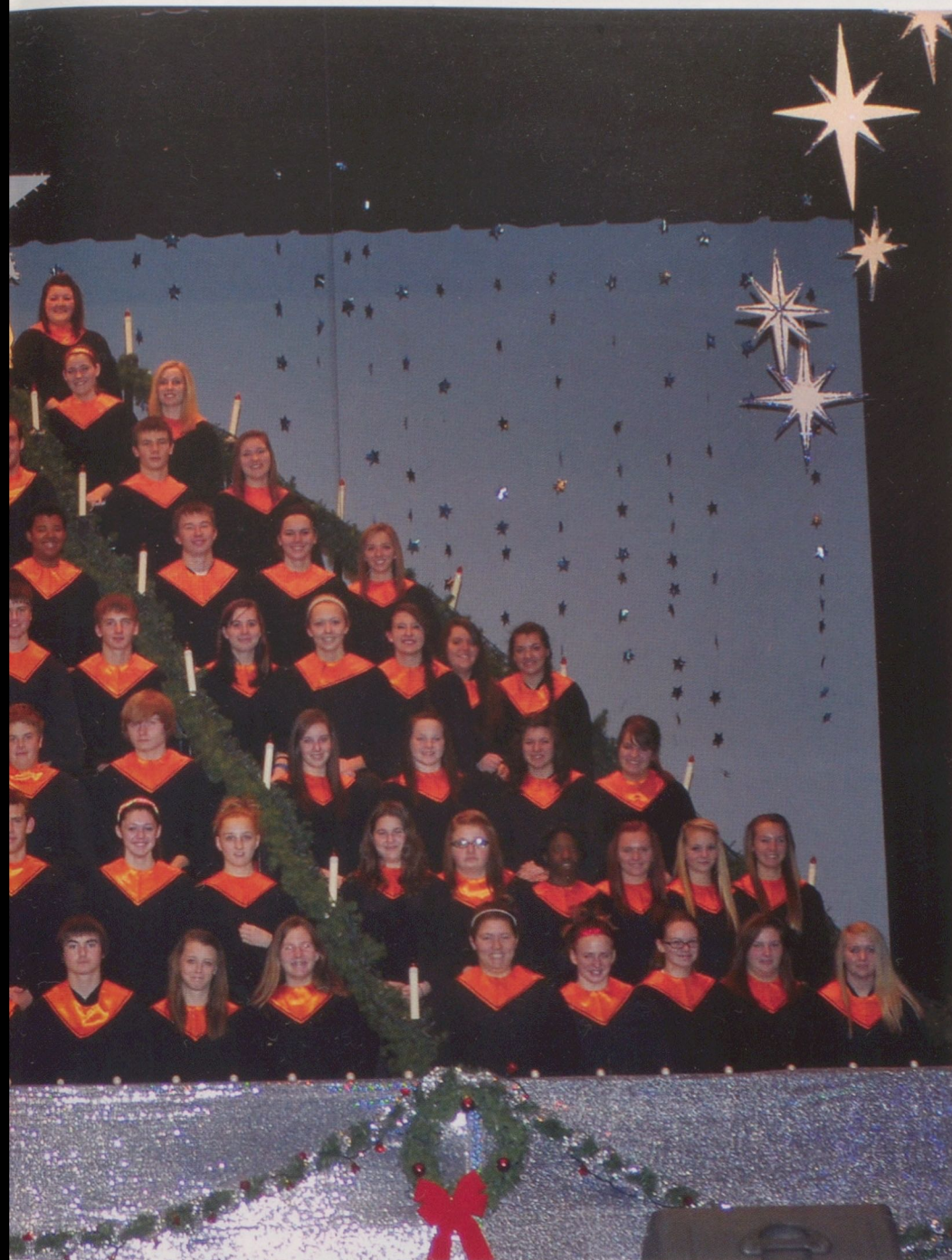

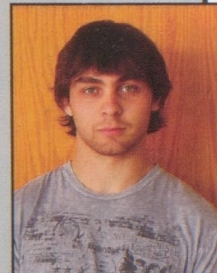

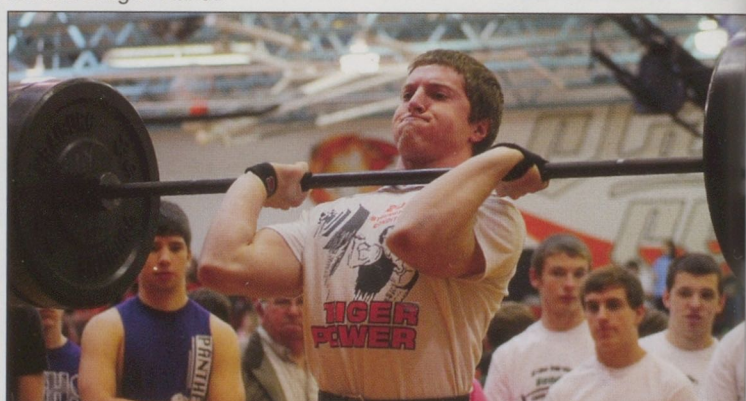

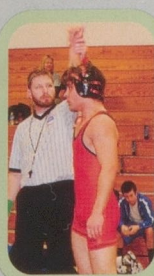

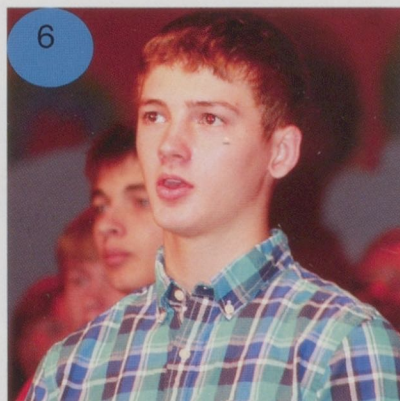

The most rewarding part of the program is seeing the students complete the program and move on to live on their own.

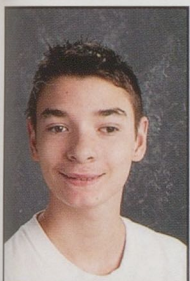
Project Hope, another part of Project Promise, is designed to help the students that are not yet capable of living on their own find group homes and jobs.

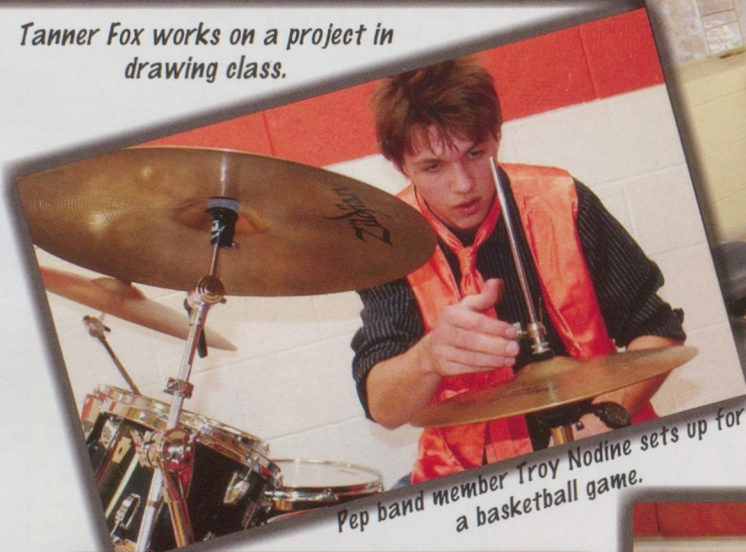

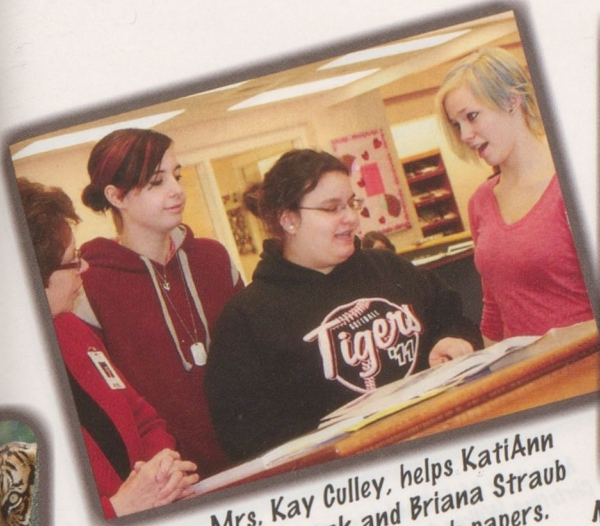

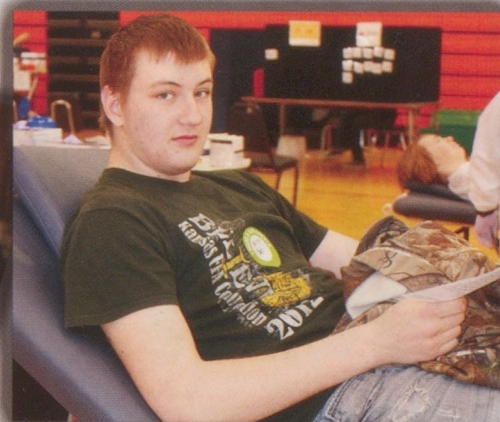

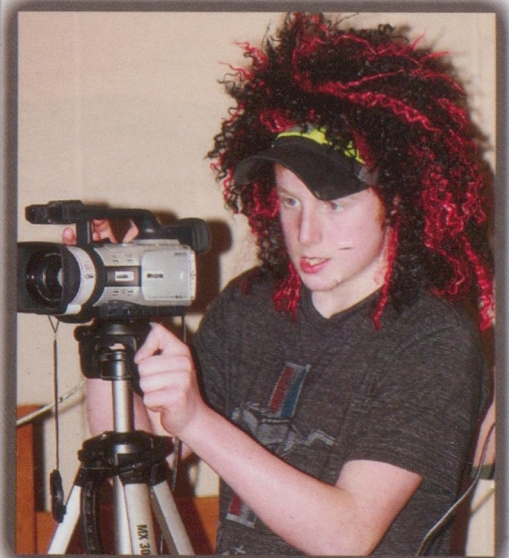

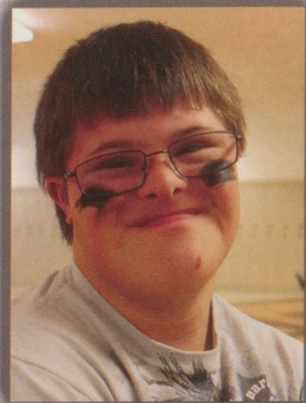

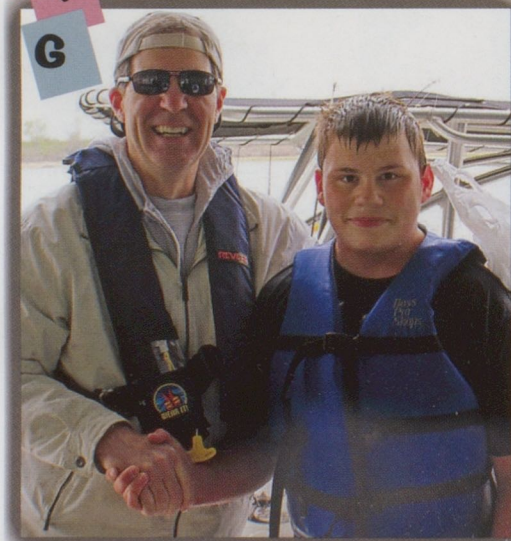
