





Metal's teacher Mr. Gary Unruh retired at the end of the 2002-2003 school year after serving at CCCHS for 37 years and 6 years at other schools.


Mr. Unruh began his own education in a rural school. He attended Columbia School for grades 1-4 (1944-1948) and attended Square Top School for the next four years.


