
INFOGRAPHICS

SENIORS: Prom II, the football games, ordering announcements, scholarship applications, go-ed, graduation practices and the last day of school.






There were some new faces among the staff this year.


The football team had some success ending the year with a 7-3 record. The volleyball team was also successful with a 21-7 record.






The 1991 volleyball team had a great season finishing 21-7.




Needless to say, Tiger football this year was IMPRES-SIVE. The team went from 2-7 last season to 7-3 this season.

This was followed by victories over Russell and Wamego, the latter being especially sweet as it was Homecoming. Their four game winning streak was broken by the Chapman Irish.


In District play the Tigers defeated Concordia, Beloit and Marysville and tied for the Championship in the NCKL with the Abilene Cowboys.

Goodland proved to be too much for them in the play-offs, but the Tigers did make their first appearance in the "Sweet 16" since 1988.






"I was extremely pleased with the way we played at regionals," Coach Ray Minnich said. "We played the best tennis of the season."









The girls opened their season at the Belleville Tournament. They went 0-3, but were up against some very experienced teams.



The team played two more non-league games against Council Grove and Wabunsee.


Then they closed out the season with five league games before their season ended when they lost to Marysville in Sub-State action.







Individually, Kevin Ross was medalist at Wamego and Brad Ficke was second medalist at Clay Center and at the NCKL meet.


The boys ended their season with a fifth place finish at Regionals which was held at Marysville.






The groups at CCCHS have kept busy throughout the year.


We had the usual activities this year, which included plays, musical performances and crownings. You will read about these on the following pages.







The commencement speaker was Dee James, a 1977 graduate of CCCHS. He is now a lawyer in Abilene.


