2 **Admission of Students Who Reside Out of the State of Nebraska**

3  
4 Students who reside in a state other than Nebraska must submit an application  
5 to enroll in the district at least three weeks prior to the beginning of the  
6 semester in which they wish to begin attending the district. Out of state  
7 students may not enroll mid-semester.

8  
9 The administration will review each application and is authorized to admit out-  
10 of-state students whose academic history, disciplinary records, prior school  
11 community involvement and other relevant factors indicate that they will be  
12 successful in this school district. Those who have verified disabilities pursuant  
13 to the Individuals with Disabilities in Education Act or section 504 of the  
14 Rehabilitation Act will not be excluded from admission based solely on their  
15 disability. The administration may reject an out-of-state student when  
16 acceptance of the student:

- 18 • Would increase the operating costs of the school district, such as by  
19 requiring the hiring of new staff or contracting with outside entities to  
20 provide services to the student;
  - 21
  - 22 • Would require the procurement of new equipment, technology, or  
23 furnishings;
  - 24
  - 25 • Would cause or require the rearrangement of caseloads for staff and  
26 contracted professionals;
  - 27
  - 28 • Is reasonably deemed by appropriate school staff to pose a potential  
29 risk to the health or safety of students or staff;
  - 30
  - 31 • May pose a risk of adversely affecting the quality of educational services  
32 being provided to resident students, as determined by appropriate  
33 school staff.

35 The administration's approval or disapproval of an out-of-state student's  
36 application is final.

37  
38 Out-of-state students who are admitted pursuant to this policy must meet the  
39 requirements of board policy 5002 and must comply with each board policy,  
40 state statute and regulation that applies to their situation. Once admitted,  
41 they will be subject to the same disciplinary rules and procedures as resident  
42 students. Students must reapply for admission prior to each semester. Re-  
43 admission may be denied for students who are not academically and/or

44 behaviorally successful. Once admitted, out-of-state students' grade level  
45 placement will be determined in accordance with district policy.

47 Out-of-state students are not entitled to transportation or reimbursement for  
48 transportation.

49

50 Out-of-state students will be charged tuition as determined annually by the  
51 Board of Education, to be no less than per pupil cost. Payment in full is due  
52 to the central office of the district on or before the first day of classes each  
53 semester. The tuition fee may be changed by the board of education prior to  
54 any semester with or without notice to the out-of-state student's family or  
55 resident school district.
