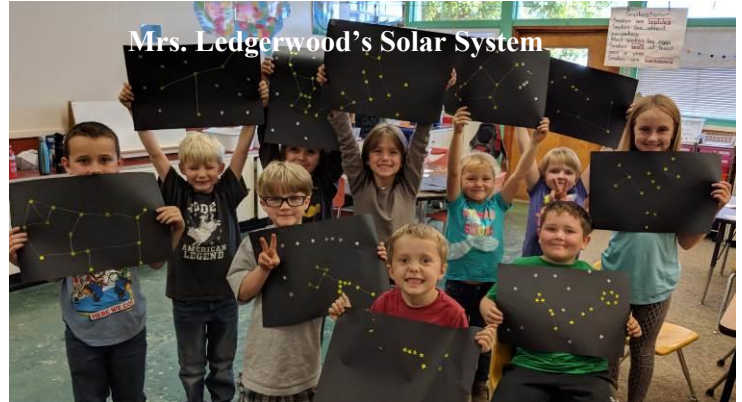

Crow native Cody Tripp battled cancer throughout his high school years and still managed to graduate on time with his Crow High School class in 2013. A year later, he was pronounced cancer-free. It looked like he could move on with his life. He went to work at West Lane Tree Service, LLC, and started dating Veneta native Andrea Culbertson. So it came as a horrible shock in July 2018 when he was told his cancer is back. While he does have health insurance to help cover treatment, there are many extra costs for him and his family, such as travel expenses to the treatment center 130 miles away and lost wages.
