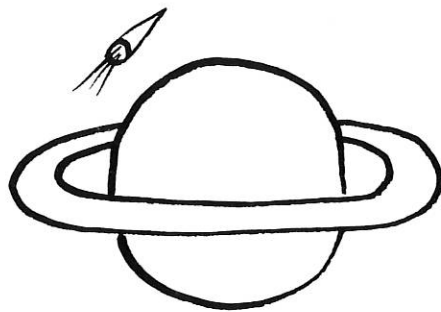
MR. ALDEN WARMAN

Then in 1932, he resumed teaching in the Peshastin schools, where he taught for 26 years.

Since his retirement in 1958 he has been very busy. Aside from being a substitute teacher, he is Secretary of the Tri-County Retired Teachers Association, Secretary-Treasurer of the Tandy Ditch Company, Sunday School Teacher, P.T.A. Committeeman, and is on the Chelan County Fair Board.

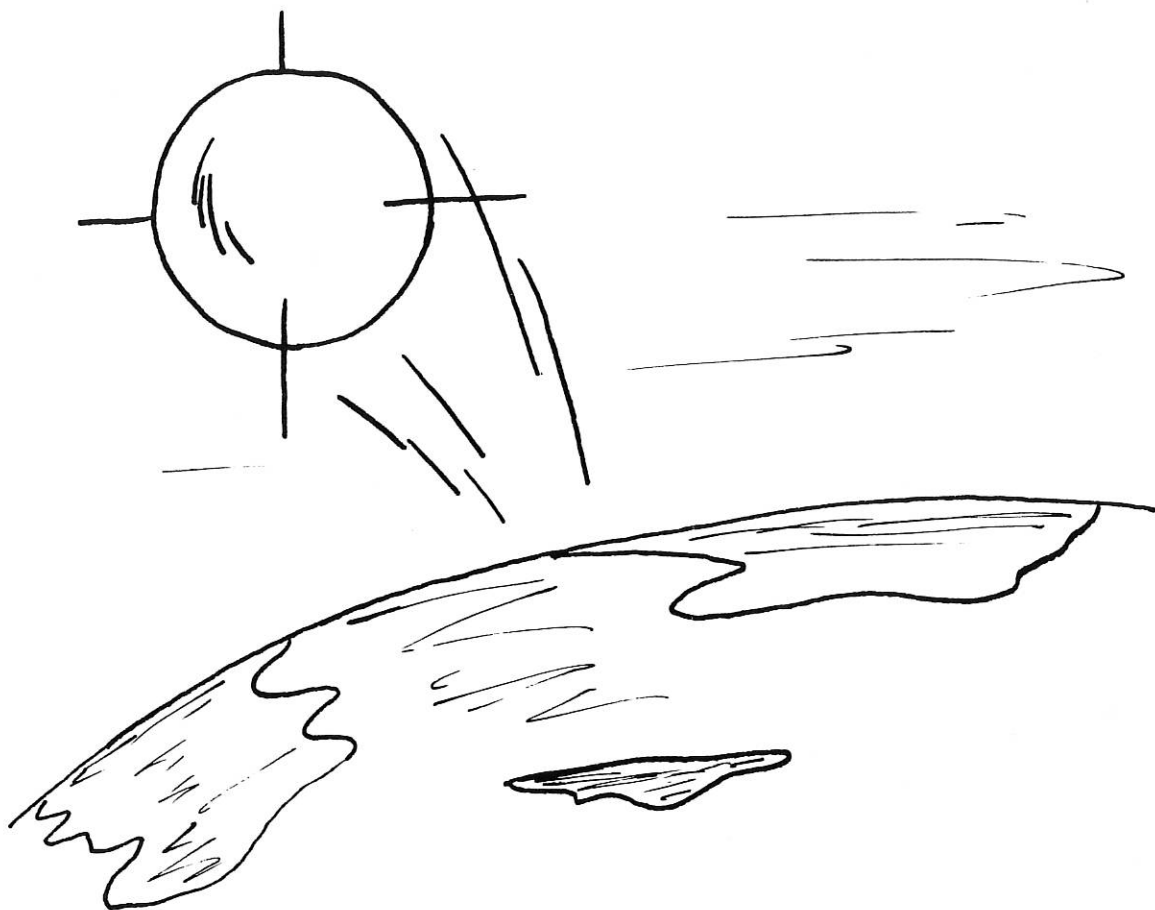

Climax of the year will be graduation exercises.

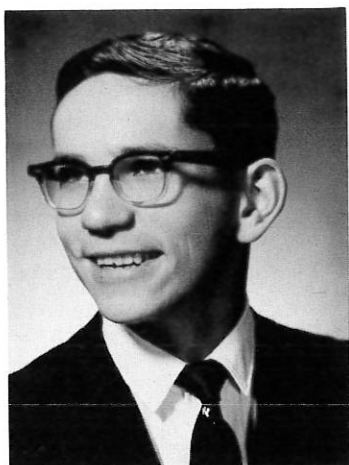

The first team this year was composed of three seniors, three sophomores, and three freshmen, with five freshmen filling in. Highlight of the season was the game with Cashmere, which Peshastin-Dryden won by a score of 2 to 0. Dennis Evans pitched a 1-hit ball game behind an errorless infield. P-D scored on a squeeze play. The defense was helped by Danny Widmer's life-saving running-catch in the outfield.

Rick Whaley and Dave Pflugrath shared catching honors, while John McGregor and Jerry Burgess made up the Keystone combination. Filling in at first base was Dave Pflugrath and at the hot corner of third base was Ron Tangen.

Climax of the baseball season came when the Bridgeport Mustangs traveled to P-D to participate in the league championship game. The game was held for the first time on P-D's new field. After 7 errors by P-D and 3 by Bridgeport, Bridgeport won the game by a score of 6 to 3. For the first time in three years, the trophy left Peshastin-Dryden and went to Bridgeport.

In the pitchers department, Dennis Evans finished the year with 6 losses and 3 wins. Rick Whaley had 2 wins and 0 losses. Larry Gurnard had 1 loss and 0 wins.

In the hitting department Rick Whaley led the team with an average of .296 followed by Dennis Evans with .286 and Jerry Burgess with .250.

Peshastin-Dryden Track and Field Team ranked high in North Central Washington this year in both individual and team strength.

The team started the season by winning the Upper Wenatchee Valley Championship (Cashmere, Leavenworth, Peshastin-Dryden), took third at Ritzville in a field of 28 Eastern Washington teams, won the Leavenworth Invitational, and followed it up by coping the Chelan-Douglas League Championship and placing second to Wenatchee in the "A" County Meet.

Four boys qualified for the district tournament in Moses Lake. They were Ted Whaley, who placed 2nd in the 880, 3rd in the broadjump, and 5th in the relay; Rick Whaley, who placed 2nd in the high jump and 5th in the relay; Chuck Evans, who placed 6th in the 440 and 5th in the relay; and Virgil Umbarger, who placed 5th in the relay.

Other outstanding point winners for the season were Dan Widmer, a consistant winner in the shot, discus, and javelin, Robert Anderson, in the mile, and Chuck Foster, in the pole vault.

Many of the team members are returning to Cougarville next year with high hopes of another successful season.



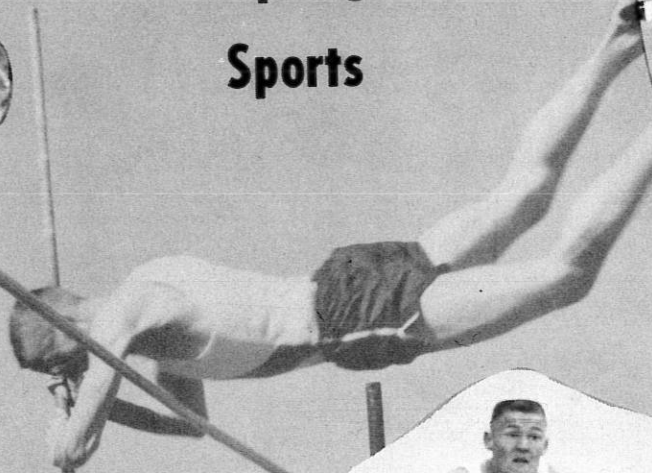

Sophomore Curtis Franz, with his outstanding rebounding, earned honorable mention recognition at District.

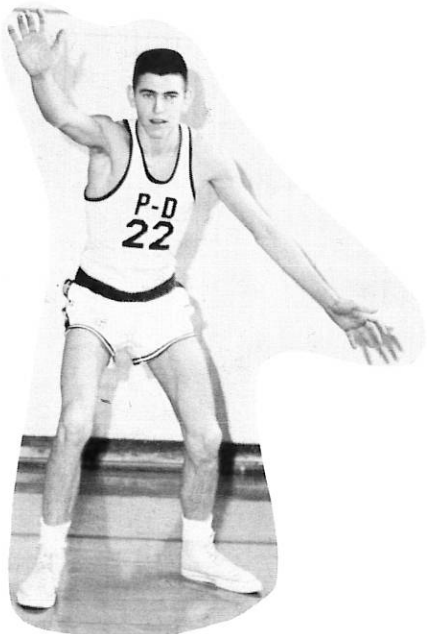

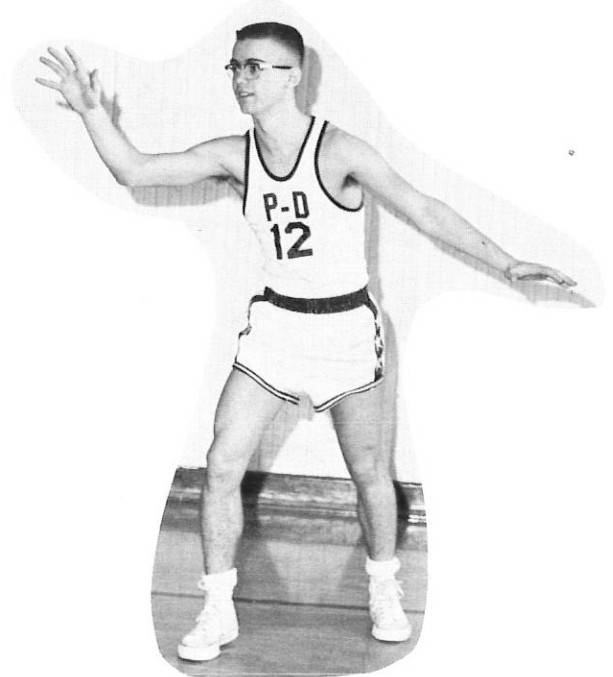

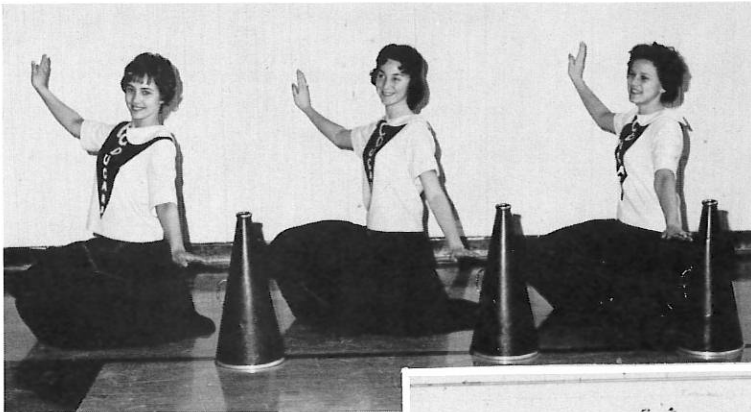
