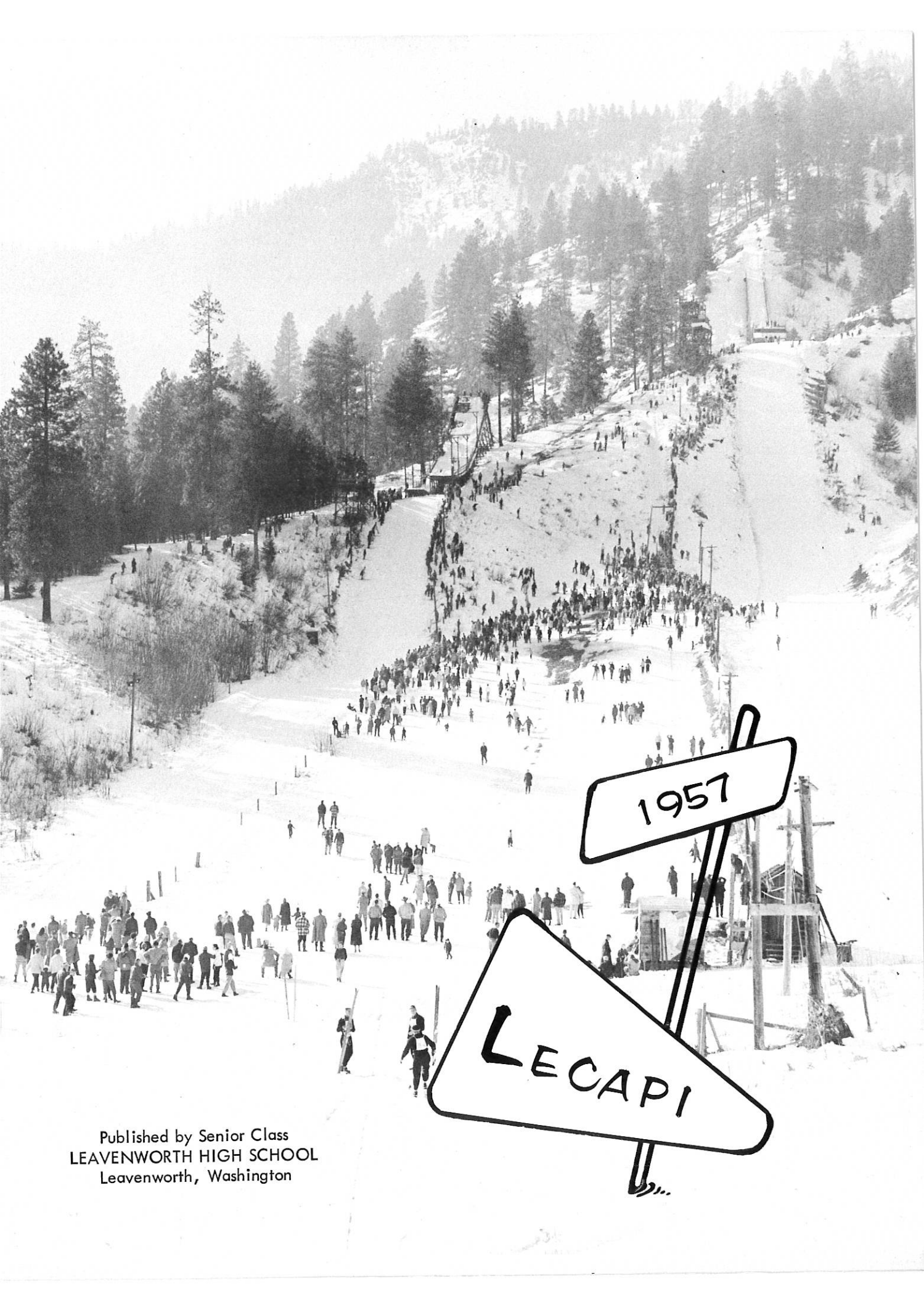

Dr. Hopkins was a prominent physician and surgeon in the Northwest greatly admired and respected by countless numbers of men, women and children.

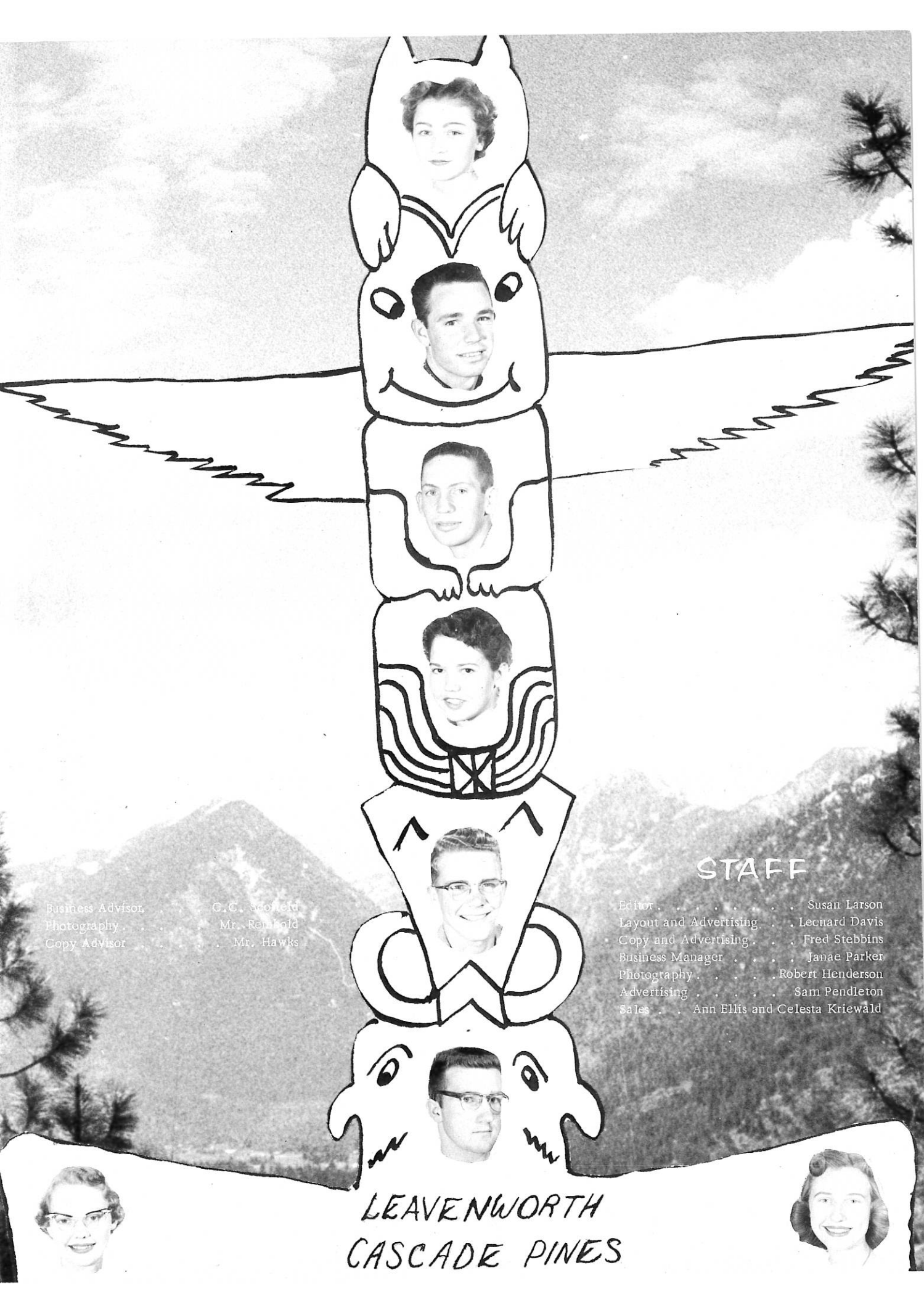
He was vitally interested in the community and was active in its affairs, having served two terms as mayor of Leavenworth. It was largely through his efforts that the first community swimming pool was constructed.

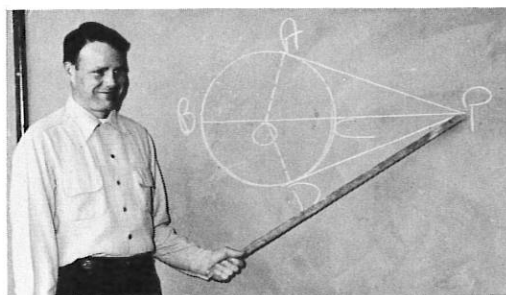

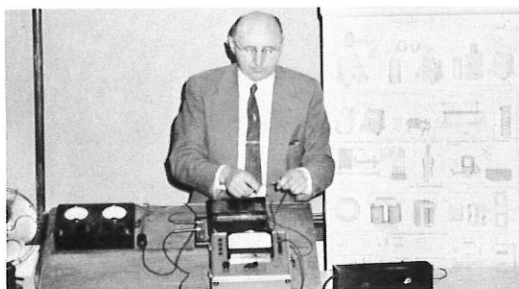

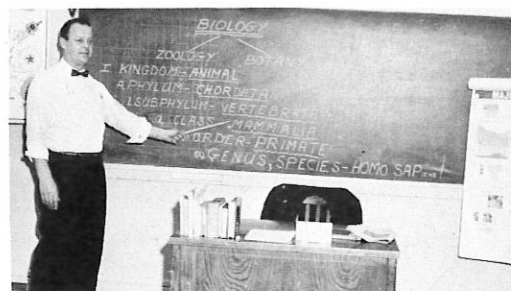

SENIOR HISTORY

On the morning of August 27, 1945, 51 first graders started their education under the direction of Mrs. Stage and Mrs. Druzak. On the morning of August 27, 1956, 25 seniors registered for their final year of high school education.

Of the 51 students starting in 1945, nine completed all twelve years of their education in the Leavenworth school. These are Fred Stebbins, Christine Baird, Robert Henderson, Ann Ellis, Mearl Bergren, Sandra Bon, Darrel Staley, Susan Larson and Sam Pendleton. Sandra Ferrel and Larry Ward started with the class, attended school elsewhere and returned later to graduate with us. During the years of school Jim Thompson and Leonard Davis entered in the fourth grade, Dan Southwick, Pat Allen and Roger Knowlton in the fifth grade, Jack Cowley in the sixth grade and Jim George, Christine Kaufmann, Celesta Kriewald and Janae Parker in the eighth grade.

At eighth grade graduation, Janae Parker and Sandra Bon won the scholarship awards. Sandra Bon and Jack Cowley were the recipients of the American Legion awards and Roger Knowlton and Christine Baird won the Outstanding Patrol awards.

Eleanor Dymont and Terry McMahon joined the class in the Freshman year, Don Merry in the Junior year and Bill Mark his Senior year.

We entered high school with 51 members and were properly initiated with the girls dressed as babies and the boys dressed as girls. We were guests at the annual Freshman-Sophomore Picnic.

In our Sophomore year we started with 47 members. Our activities included selling concessions at football and basketball games and sponsoring the annual Freshman-Sophomore Picnic at Recreation Park.

The Junior Class had 35 energetic students who held two dances, presented the play, "The Clutching Claw", held the Junior Class Talent Show and honored the Senior Class with the Junior-Senior Prom and Banquet, "Southern Mansion".

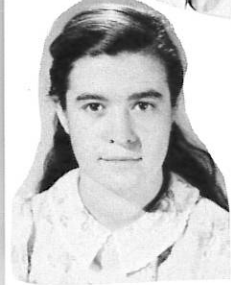

Senior Honor Day was held May 17. Baccalaureate was held May 19 and Commencement May 21. Following graduation exercises various organizations of the community honored us at a party at the Starlight Room of the Tumwater Cafe.



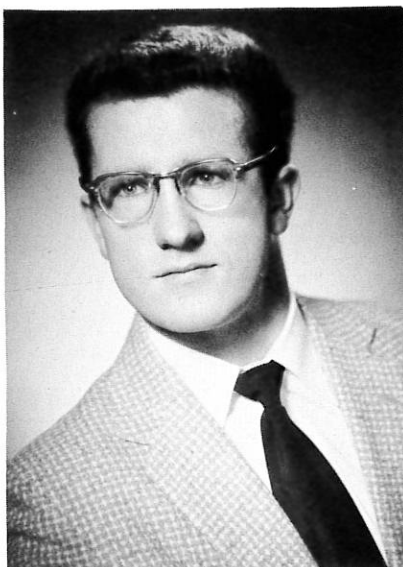
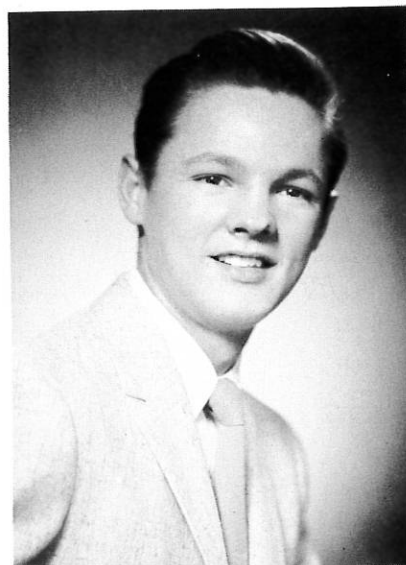

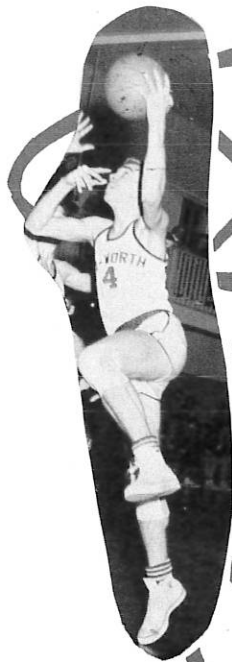
FOOTBALL

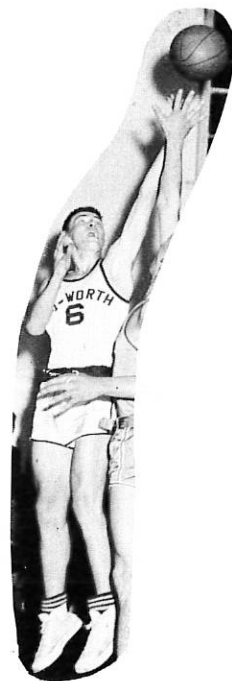

BASKETBALL

Between December 8 and February 13 Leavenworth experienced one of the most successful basketball seasons in a number of years. The Grizzlies posted 12 wins and 6 losses during the season.

During the Christmas vacation the Grizzlies brought home the first place trophy from the Waterville Invitational Tournament by defeating Waterville in the finals 31-22.
