CHAMBERS PUBLIC SCHOOL 2022-2023 REOPENING PLAN/GUIDELINES

While safe decisions may decide the general format that school takes in the fall, it will be the responsibility of the administration and the Board of Education to decide the fine details on the specific format. The general format used by Chambers Public School that will be utilized with the opening of the new school year will fall into one of three modes based on community spread of COVID-19. These modes are (1) low or no spread, (2) minimal or moderate spread, or (3) substantial spread. The general format that the school year may take based on the modes would appear as follows:
