CARS KIDS!

How the Tickets Work: When a student is handed a ticket, they are told what CARS expectation they met. This is a positive reinforcement. Students write their names on tickets and place them in a large "gas tank" by the office. Some teachers choose to collect tickets as a class, then have a student(s) take them down once a week, etc. Once a week, names are drawn during announcements. These students come down to the office for a small prize. When the gas tank is full, there is a schoolwide celebration.

Operating Millage Proposal on the Ballot for November 8, 2022

The State of Michigan expects all school districts to levy 18 mills from nonhomestead properties for operating costs. If a district levies under 18 mills, there is no adjustment in State aid to allow for the reduction in funding. The PPS Board of Education approved a resolution at August's regular meeting to place an operating millage proposal on the ballot for the November 2022 election. If passed, this proposal would renew the current 17.6090 mills levied for operating costs for the next 10 years. In addition, it would provide an additional 0.5 mill to be used to bring the operating millage back to the maximum 18 operating mills that school districts are permitted to levy. Public Schools periodically ask voters to vote on an 18-mill levy on non-homestead properties in order to receive their full foundation allowance from the state. The tax only applies to properties such as second homes, commercial and rental properties, not primary residences. The funds from the operating millage go towards the district's operating budget and day-to-day classroom operations.
