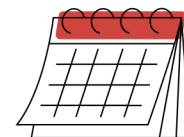
VETERANS DAY

CARS KIDS!

What can you do to help your child stay on the path to positive behavior?

- Review CARS expectations
- Acknowledge appropriate behavior
- Talk about their day at school
- Establish routines
- Make sure your child is ready for school every day
- Keep in touch with your child's teacher
- Model appropriate language and tone
- Practice positive phrases and manners
- Get plenty of sleep

'Tis the season to watch out for head lice!

Ways to Stay Ahead of Lice

- Watch for signs of head lice, such as frequent head scratching, flaky or irritated scalp, scabs, or the presence of nits. Nits are yellowish-white, oval-shaped, and are attached to the hair.
- Check at least once a week.
- Consult a pharmacist or doctor for treatment options.
- To eliminate head lice successfully, it is very important that all treatment instructions and steps be carefully followed and completed.
- Remove all nits.
- Wash bedding and recently worn clothing in hot water and dry in high heat for at least 30 minutes.
- Vacuum daily

Head lice can be a nuisance but they have not been shown to spread disease. Children diagnosed with live head lice do not need to be sent home early from school; they can go home at the end of the day, be treated, and return to class after appropriate treatment has begun.
