Greetings to our CTA Charger Community!

My name is Autumn Mattson, and I have the privilege of serving as the Superintendent at Creative Technologies Academy. For the past 22 years, I have worked in education as a teacher, coach, presenter, consultant, High School Athletic Director, Dean of Students, and Elementary Principal. All of these experiences brought me to Creative Technologies Academy, where I am inspired and excited to be working with a dedicated and collaborative staff who always puts their student's needs as their top priority.

Here at Creative Technologies Academy, the 2022-23 school year marks twenty-four years of providing free public education and doing what is best for children and families. We continue to take pride in educating and preparing students for the rigors of college and careers while supporting them to lead fulfilling and productive lives. We are committed to continuing our legacy of success in partnering with families and our communities. Our goal is to shape our students into tomorrow's leaders so they can positively influence their homes, communities, workplaces, and the world.

Many ask: "What is a public charter school?" Charter schools are free, independently-operated public schools that have the flexibility and autonomy to meet their students' needs. As public schools, charters are held to the same state-mandated academic standards and participate in the same state testing. Charter schools, like traditional public schools, are funded according to enrollment and receive funding from the state according to the number of students attending. Every single charter school in Michigan is a tuition-free, public entity with nonprofit status.

Creative Technologies Academy is required to meet all local, state, and federal requirements. In addition to meeting these requirements, Ferris State University authorizes Creative Technologies Academy's charter contract. Authorizers are the institutions that create contracts with their charter schools, set expectations, oversee school performance, and decide which schools should continue to serve students. We value our relationship with Ferris State University as our authorizer, as well as our partnerships with the Kent Intermediate School District and other local districts.

As we start the 2023 year, we welcome the opportunity for celebration, self-reflection, and growth. The first half of this school year has been exciting at Creative Technologies Academy. We have opened a new middle school building, completed a new soccer field, celebrated our academic growth, and partnered with many current and new students and families. We hope that this newsletter will provide you with an opportunity to view our accomplishments and learn more information about our school.
