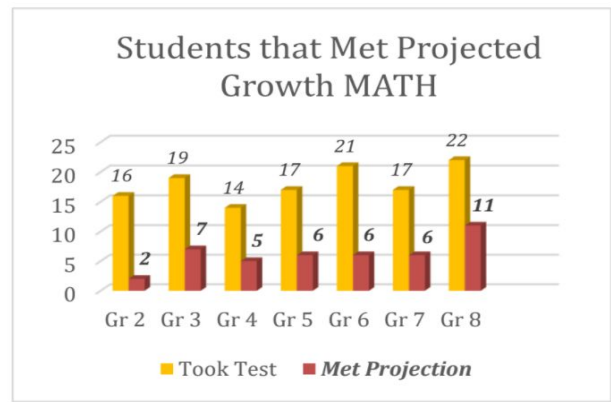
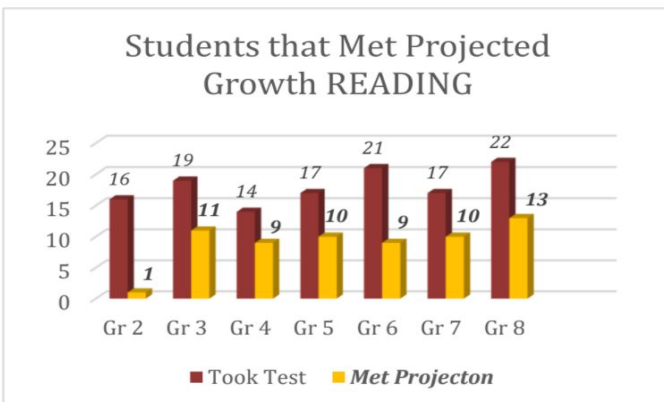
2019-20 Creative Technologies Academy NWEA Data

Mid Year Update on Benchmark Assessments

- CTA is making substantial progress towards collecting the data around our mid-year goals with intentional plans to administer the test to all students, gather the data, and then analyze it to make necessary adjustments to our instruction.
- CTA administered the FALL NWEA within the first six (6) weeks of school to our in-person and virtual students and will begin to administer the WINTER NWEA the week of January 11, 2021. We will have completed all in-person and virtual K-8th student's NWEA testing by February 12, 2021.
- Weekly PLC meetings will be held to support the data analysis as the scores and reports are collected, and adjustments to teaching and instruction will be made accordingly to continue the progress towards our achievement and growth goals.
- The NWEA is an MDE approved nationally normed assessment that will allow us to set individual academic goals for our K-8 students in math and reading and drive instruction for both in-person and virtual learning.
- To maintain equitable access to all students, we will provide an opportunity for our virtual students to attend proctored testing sessions on campus while also providing clear directions and support on administering the test from home.
- All students that require testing accommodations will have these provided to them.
