

Recent News and Events


<u>Cardus Study</u>: The *Cardus Study* is a comprehensive study done on the motivations and impacts of Christian school education. The study compares graduates from different schools—Christian, home, religious, Catholic and non-religious. An interesting trend emerges from the data.


According to the study, Christian school graduates report a higher rate of the following in comparison to their counterparts:

- 1) Infallibility of Scripture
- 2) Church Attendance
- 3) Tithing
- 4) Reading the Bible individually and as a family
- 5) Praying individually and as a family
- 6) Being more politically involved
- 7) Greater involvement in their community
- 8) Serving in missions
- 9) Seeking a job that fulfills their calling
- 10) Preparedness for college

LEGO Club: Over 20 students are participating in our first session of LEGO Club, and we have many more students signed up for future sessions. Students are divided up into primary and intermediate groups and are busy completing LEGO builds. Students also get to program their creations. We feel so blessed for the fundraising done by the elementary students in last year's Read-A-Thon to provide this opportunity for our students.

<u>Teacher Training in Technology</u>: Already this year, our teachers have had two opportunities to receive outside training in technology. Title II funds through

the Gresham-Barlow School District were used to send all of the teachers to the Oregon Google Summit. At the Google Summit, teachers were exposed to the variety of ways Google Classroom can be used to extend and share student learning. The conference also exposed the additional infrastructure required to fully take advantage of all



the technology we currently have and would like to procure in the future.

In addition, Technology Coach Amanda Taylor traveled up from Orange County, where she coaches educators at Saddleback Unified School District. She spent two days on our campus exposing our students and teachers to *Ozobots*, tiny robots that provide opportunities for our teachers to fuse programming and robotics with the content they are already teaching students.

Exchange Students: We are thrilled to have six exchange students attending DCS this year. This diverse group represents Germany, Spain, Israel, Rwanda and the Philippines. Not only do these students provide additional diversity to our student population, they provide our regular student body with an opportunity to experience the beauty of the larger body of Christ and to learn about a new culture. Grandparents' Day: Grandparents streamed into the sanctuary last Friday to worship with our secondary students and hear our special speaker, Bruce Malone.
