Dear,
A new law RCW 28A.210.320 has been enacted in Washington State. The law provides that a child may not attend school in the absence of a medication or treatment order and nursing care plan if the child has a life-threatening condition that might require medical services to be provided at school.
Under the law, "life-threatening condition" means a health condition that will put the child in danger of death during the school day if a medication or treatment order and a nursing care plan are not in place. This includes students with conditions such as severe allergies, seizures, severe asthma, diabetes, certain heart conditions and other critical types of medical complications.
According to our records, your child has a health condition such as that described above that may require treatment during the school day. Please provide the necessary information, medications, and any required equipment to the school as soon as possible. This includes medication procedures and physician instructions. Upon receiving the required paperwork and/or equipment will write a nursing care plan and complete any other necessary paperwork, which will then enable your student to attend school. We need this information by in order to comply with this law's requirement.
