Start of School Information-

Registration- Students should be registered for school. If not, click the Registration Link or contact the HHS office for an *Infosnap* code to begin the process.

Freshman Day- All incoming 9th graders are encouraged to attend Freshman Day on Tues., Aug 6, from 9:30am-11:15am in the HHS Commons to receive schedules, tour the building, and learn about school life at HHS. This event is for students only and put on by HHS Counselors and Student Ambassadors. It is a great way to transition to the new school year!

<u>Semester I Schedules & PowerSchool Access-</u> Parents/students may pick up class schedules in the HHS Office on <u>Wed., Aug. 7th and Thurs., Aug 8th from 8:00am-3:00pm.</u> Schedules will also be available via <u>PowerSchool beginning Fri., Aug., 9th.</u>

<u>Semester I Schedule Changes</u>- Students needing schedule changes can make appointments for August 9th or see their school counselor the first two days of school. Changes <u>can only</u> be made if a student did not request the scheduled course. Level changes require approval from teachers, parents and administration. First Day- Wed., Aug. 14 is the first day of school with classes beginning at 7:40am and dismissal occurring at 2:35pm. HHS Handbook, Behavior Expectations & Class Meetings- Students will review the HHS Handbook and Behavior Expectations during 1st period on Wed., Aug. 14. Handbooks are online at HHS Student Handbook. HHS Student Behavior Expectations

- 1. Use Respectful & Appropriate Language.

- Speak kindly towards and about others
- Keep conversations school appropriate
- 2. Display a Readiness to Learn.
- Be on time
- Be prepared
- Have necessary materials for class
- Complete assignments on time

HHS Student Behavior Expectations

- 3. Show <u>Respect</u> to everyone-peers, faculty & staff, school property, and yourself.
- Be positive, kind, and courteous
- Be considerate of learning environment, personal property, space, and opinions of others
- Be accountable for your actions
- Participate and represent our school with class
- 4. Use Professionalism with Phone/Electronic Devices
- Store devices out of sight during instruction
- Use electronic devices only when teacher directed
- Think before posting on social media

Parking & Student Lot- Please see the Student Lot configuration which includes parent pick-up and drop off areas and Student Parking info. A reminder that students should not park in the teacher lot, middle school lot, or visitor locations. Students are also asked to avoid loitering in the student lot and to keep it clean. Parking tags for those who ordered online through MySchoolBucks will be delivered to students when school begins.

<u>Phone</u> policy is attached. We ask that students are mindful of their usage and follow school procedures. Students should not have phones out in class without teacher permission. Misuse of electronic devices will result in school consequences and a loss of phone privileges at school. Please talk to your student about the importance of using electronic devices in moderation and

School Supplies- HHS does not have a specific school supply list as each classroom teacher provides a list when school begins. HHS Athletics & Fall Sports- Fall Sports begin on Monday, Aug. 12. Please complete a Fall Sport Registration Form prior to tryouts. Sports physicals must be completed and turned into Highland High School before Monday, Aug. 12. All athletes need current physicals to tryout for sports. (Athletic physicals are valid for 13 months.) Please see IHSA Physical Form and visit the HHS Athletic Website for more details regarding athletics. There will be an all Fall Sports Parent Meeting on Thursday, Aug. 15 at 6pm in the HHS Commons. We ask that one parent/guardian attend to learn about the upcoming season.

Physicals, Immunizations & Medications- All incoming 9th graders need current physicals and dental exams and all students must be up to date with immunizations. Any medication – over the counter or prescription – requires a medication release. Paperwork regarding medical information can be found online at Student Forms.
