# Annual Public School Board Meeting September 10, 2018 (2018-2019)

Under the Federal Educational Program ESSA ("Every Student Succeeds Act") we receive funding from the following Federal Programs.

#### Title I - Part A

The largest program of federal aid for Elementary and Secondary Education. This year's *preliminary allocation* amount is \$182,061.84. This is a decrease of \$2,454.33.

Most of Title I funds are used for salaries and benefits for:

(FTE – Full Time Equivalency)

- Reading Recovery Specialist (1.0 FTE)
- Federal Programs Coordinator (.50 FTE)
- Instructional Assistants
  - o (3) at 1.0 FTE (Ashley Riddle, Debbie Scott, Elisha Brown)
  - o (1) at .25 FTE (Karen Seal)
  - o (1) at .875 FTE (Jourdan Moore)
  - o (1) at .50 FTE (Tishana Laxton)
- The remaining funds are used for supplemental materials and supplies for teachers and their classrooms, parental involvement activities, and homeless students that meet the federal requirements and guidelines.

#### Title II-A

Known as the "Improving Teacher Quality Grant". These funds will be used for a class-size reduction teacher, salary and benefits (1.0 FTE). This year's preliminary allocation amount is \$29,484.99. This is an increase of \$748.99

#### Title V- State

The Rural and Low-Income School Program (RLIS). These funds can be used for the same purposes as Title I-Part A and Title IIA, as well as, professional development, teacher recruitment and retention, parental involvement activities and classroom supplies for both campuses. This year's preliminary allocation amount is \$16,403.75. This is an increase of \$452.64.

# The Arkansas Comprehensive School Improvement Plan (ACSIP)

The ASCIP Committee consistently reviews the School Improvement Plan throughout the year to determine school improvement needs. The decisions will be made about specific materials and programs that are purchased with federal funds.

- The current school enrollment of Piggott High School stands at 414.

- ACT Aspire NEA Coop rankings improved compared to the prior school year. 7 top 8 scores compared to 3 the previous school year. 8 top Clay County scores compared to 1 the previous school year.
- Variety of school organizations have been involved in volunteerism throughout the community.
- Our clubs have produced excellent results.

National Gold Seal Chapter, National Outstanding Chapter, and National Chapter Challenge Award.
  - 2. FFA- Recently was named 3<sup>rd</sup> place overall out of 70 schools in the Eastern Arkansas Sweepstakes. They were also #1 in schools of similar size and Clay County in Eastern Arkansas
  - 3. FCCLA was awarded the Silver Star at Nationals during the summer.
  - 4. Art was recognized for their outstanding mural work in town.
- Football, Golf, Tennis, and Volleyball are being competitive so far this season.
- Band During the summer, representatives of the Band won Outstanding home routine and
   Grand Champions at the Frontlines Guard Camp at Williams Baptist. They are practicing hard to
   get ready for their marching competitions
- Cheer Top Team Band Competition winner, Top Team Chant Competition winner, Sophia Porter sharpest motions award, 2 technical awards for sharp motions, all blue superior ribbons, 5 All-American nominations, stunt SAFE award, NFHS squad credentialing, and a National Championship Bid.
