102 Out of State Travel

I. Purpose: District 4151, EdVisions Off Campus (EOC) recognizes that may be traveling out of the state for workshops, conferences, events and field trips with students. This policy sets forth the conditions under which out of state travel will be reimbursed by EOC. *This policy also aligns with Policy 704: Internal Controls.*

II. General Guidelines:

- 1. The event, workshop, conference or assignment must be approved in advance by the staff finance team at a documented meeting and must include an estimate of the cost of travel. In evaluating the out of state travel request, the staff will consider the following:
 - Whether the travel and training is relevant to the staff member's role at EOC.
 - Whether the staff member will be meeting and networking with other professionals from around the country to exchange ideas on topics of relevance to the school.
 - Whether the staff member will be viewing a school or program that is similar
 in nature to one that is currently operating at, or under consideration by EOC
 where the purpose for the trip is to study or function to bring back ideas for
 the consideration of the full school and Board.
 - Whether the staff member has been specifically assigned by the staff or Board to visit another school out of state for the purpose of promoting development of an EOC- type of educational program.
 - Whether the staff member is providing an educational field trip experience for students
 - Whether EOC has sufficient funding available in the budget to pay the cost of the trip.
- 2. EdVisions Off Campus may make payments in advance for airfare, lodging and registration as arranged with the Business Manager.
 - Otherwise all payments will be made as reimbursements to the staff member.
- 3. EdVisions Off Campus will reimburse for transportation, lodging, registration and incidental costs as follows:
 - Airfare will be reimbursed at the coach rate.
 - Mileage will be reimbursed at the IRS rate. If two or more individuals travel
 together by car, only the driver will receive reimbursement. EOC will
 reimburse for the cost of taxi fare or renting an automobile if necessary to
 participate in the training, school visit, or field trip.

- Lodging costs will be limited to those that are reasonable and necessary, as determined by the Business Manager and finance team when destination is taken into consideration.
- Meal costs will be reimbursed at the rates set forth in the personnel policies and procedures manual, unless modified by Business Manager, Finance Team or Board when destination is taken into consideration.
- 4. Receipts are required for lodging, airfare and meals and should accompany an expense reimbursement form. The expense reimbursement form shall be submitted to the EOC Board Treasurer, approved and then sent to the Business Manager.
- 5. EdVisions Off Campus will not reimburse for alcoholic beverages, personal telephone calls, costs associated with the attendance of family members, rental of luxury vehicles, meals expenses if meal was included in cost of registration, meal expenses if individual elected not to eat meal provided in the registration, cost of recreational expenses such as golf or tennis.
- 6. EdVisions Off Campus will not pay for staff members who have announced an intention to resign, or are in process of termination.
- 7. Staff members who travel out of state pursuant to this policy must give a report on the results of the trip at the next staff meeting.

501 SCHOOL WEAPONS POLICY

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to assure a safe school environment for students, staff and the public.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

No student or nonstudent, including adults and visitors, shall possess, use or distribute a weapon when in a school location, including field trips off campus, except as provided in this policy. The school district will act to enforce this policy and to discipline or take appropriate action against any student, teacher, administrator, school employee, volunteer, or member of the public who violates this policy.

III. DEFINITIONS

A. "Weapon"

- 1. A "weapon" means any object, device or instrument designed as a weapon or through its use is capable of threatening or producing bodily harm or which may be used to inflict self-injury including, but not limited to, any firearm, whether loaded or unloaded; airguns; pellet guns; BB guns; all knives; blades; clubs; metal knuckles; numchucks; throwing stars; explosives; fireworks; mace and other propellants; stunguns; ammunition; poisons; chains; arrows; and objects that have been modified to serve as a weapon.
- 2. No person shall possess, use or distribute any object, device or instrument having the appearance of a weapon and such objects, devices or instruments shall be treated as weapons including, but not limited to, weapons listed above which are broken or non-functional, look-alike guns; toy guns; and any object that is a facsimile of a real weapon.
- 3. No person shall use articles designed for other purposes (i.e., lasers or laser pointers, belts, combs, pencils, files, scissors, etc.), to inflict bodily harm and/or intimidate and such use will be treated as the possession and use of a weapon.
- B. "School Location" includes any school building or grounds, whether leased, rented, owned or controlled by the school, locations of school activities or trips, bus stops, school buses or school vehicles, school-contracted vehicles, the area of entrance or departure from school premises or events, all locations where school-

- related functions are conducted, and anywhere students are under the jurisdiction of the school district.
- C. "Possession" means having a weapon on one's person or in an area subject to one's control in a school location.

IV. EXCEPTIONS

- A. A student who finds a weapon on the way to school or in a school location, or a student who discovers that he or she accidentally has a weapon in his or her possession, and takes the weapon immediately to the advisor shall not be considered to possess a weapon. If it would be impractical or dangerous to take the weapon to the advisor, a student shall not be considered to possess a weapon if he or she immediately turns the weapon over to any staff member or immediately notifies staff member of the weapon's location.
- B. It shall not be a violation of this policy if a nonstudent (or student where specified) falls within one of the following categories:
 - 1. active licensed peace officers;
 - 2. military personnel, or students or nonstudents participating in military training, who are on duty performing official duties;
 - 3. persons authorized to carry a pistol under Minn. Stat. § 624.714 while in a motor vehicle or outside of a motor vehicle for the purpose of directly placing a firearm in, or retrieving it from, the trunk or rear area of the vehicle;
 - 4. persons who keep or store in a motor vehicle pistols in accordance with Minn. Stat. §§ 624.714 or 624.715 or other firearms in accordance with § 97B.045;
 - a. Section 624.714 specifies procedures and standards for obtaining pistol permits and penalties for the failure to do so. Section 624.715 defines an exception to the pistol permit requirements for "antique firearms which are carried or possessed as curiosities or for their historical significance or value."
 - b. Section 97B.045 generally provides that a firearm may not be transported in a motor vehicle unless it is (1) unloaded and in a gun case without any portion of the firearm exposed; (2) unloaded and in the closed trunk; or (3) a handgun carried in compliance with §§ 624.714 and 624.715.
 - 5. firearm safety or marksmanship courses or activities for students or nonstudents conducted on school property;

- 6. possession of dangerous weapons, BB guns, or replica firearms by a ceremonial color guard;
- 7. a gun or knife show held on school property;
- 8. possession of dangerous weapons, BB guns, or replica firearms with written permission of the principal or other person having general control and supervision of the school or the director of a child care center; or
- 9. persons who are on unimproved property owned or leased by a child care center, school or school district unless the person knows that a student is currently present on the land for a school-related activity.

C. Policy Application to Instructional Equipment/Tools

While the school district takes a firm "Zero Tolerance" "Targeted Behavior Supports" position on the possession, use or distribution of weapons by students, and a similar position with regard to nonstudents, such a position is not meant to interfere with instruction or the use of appropriate equipment and tools by students or nonstudents. Targeted Behavior Supports allow for consequences to be based on student and situation, adjusting as needed based on safety of EOC. Such equipment and tools, when properly possessed, used and stored, shall not be considered in violation of the rule against the possession, use or distribution of weapons. However, when authorized instructional and work equipment and tools are used in a potentially dangerous or threatening manner, such possession and use will be treated as the possession and use of a weapon.

D. Firearms in School Parking Lots and Parking Facilities

A school district may not prohibit the lawful carry or possession of firearms in a school parking lot or parking facility. For purposes of this policy, the "lawful" carry or possession of a firearm in a school parking lot or parking facility is specifically limited to nonstudent permit-holders authorized under Minn. Stat. § 624.714 to carry a pistol in the interior of a vehicle or outside the motor vehicle for the purpose of directly placing a firearm in, or retrieving it from, the trunk or rear area of the vehicle. Any possession or carry of a firearm beyond the immediate vicinity of a permit-holder's vehicle shall constitute a violation of this policy.

V. CONSEQUENCES FOR STUDENT WEAPON POSSESSION/USE/DISTRIBUTION

- A. The school district takes a position of "Zero Tolerance" "Targeted Behavior Supports" in regard to the possession, use or distribution of weapons by students. Consequently, the minimum consequence(s) for students possessing, using or distributing weapons shall may include:
 - 1. immediate out-of-school suspension;

- 2. confiscation of the weapon;
- 3. immediate notification of police;
- 4. parent or guardian notification; *and/or*
- 5. recommendation to the superintendent school board of dismissal for a period of time not to exceed one year.
- B. Pursuant to Minnesota law, a student who brings a firearm, as defined by federal law, to school will be expelled for at least one year. The school board may modify this requirement on a case-by-case basis.

C. Administrative Discretion

While the school district takes a "Zero Tolerance" "Targeted Behavior Supports" position on the possession, use or distribution of weapons by students, the superintendent school officials may use discretion in determining whether, under the circumstances, a course of action other than in addition to the minimum consequences specified above is warranted. If so, other appropriate action may be taken, including consideration of a recommendation for lesser discipline.

VI. CONSEQUENCES FOR WEAPON POSSESSION/USE/DISTRIBUTION BY NONSTUDENTS

A. <u>Employees</u>

- 1. An employee who violates the terms of this policy is subject to disciplinary action, including nonrenewal, suspension, or discharge as deemed appropriate by the school board.
- 2. Sanctions against employees, including nonrenewal, suspension, or discharge shall be pursuant to and in accordance with applicable statutory authority, collective bargaining agreements, and school district policies.
- 3. When an employee violates the weapons policy, law enforcement may be notified, as appropriate.

B. Other Nonstudents

- 1. Any member of the public who violates this policy shall be informed of the policy and asked to leave the school location. Depending on the circumstances, the person may be barred from future entry to school locations. In addition, if the person is a student in another school district, that school district may be contacted concerning the policy violation.
- 2. If appropriate, law enforcement will be notified of the policy violation by

the member of the public and may be asked to provide an escort to remove the member of the public from the school location.

515 Admission Policy

I. General Statement of Policy for Admission

Edvisions Off-Campus I has established April 15th as the cut off date for new enrollments for the current school year. No students will begin enrollment with EOC if their enrollment forms are turned in after April 15th or they are on the waiting list. Students who are on the waiting list as of April 15th will be put in the lottery for the next school year.

EdVisions Off Campus has established April 30 as the cut off date for fall enrollment for the following year. May 1st a lottery will be held for admissions. Following that date, any remaining or new applications will be put on a waiting list and enrollment will be determined by the date of application. EOC will not discriminate against any applicant on any basis, although as law allows, we will give preference to siblings of current students. Furthermore, students in good standing who study abroad will be admitted upon their return.

527 PROTECTION AND PRIVACY OF PUPIL RECORDS

Independent School District No. 4151 gives notice to parents of students currently in attendance in EOC, of their rights regarding pupil records.

- 1. Parents and eligible students are hereby informed that they have the following rights:
 - a. That parent or eligible student has a right to inspect and review the student's education records:
 - b. That the parent or eligible student has a right to request the amendment of the student's education records to ensure that those records are not inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy or other rights;
 - c. That the parent or eligible student has a right to deny consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that federal and state law and the regulations promulgated thereunder authorize disclosures without consent;
 - d. That the parent or eligible student has a right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education regarding an alleged failure by the school district to comply with the requirements of 20 U.S.C.1232g, and the rules promulgated thereunder;
 - e. That the parent or eligible student has a right to obtain a copy of the school's policy regarding the protection and privacy of pupil records; and
 - f. That copies of the school's policy regarding the protection and privacy of school records are located on the school server.
- 2. Independent School District No. 4151 has adopted a school board policy in order to comply with state and federal laws regarding education records. The policy does the following:
 - a. It classifies records as public, private or confidential.
 - b. It establishes procedures and regulations to permit parents or students to inspect and review a student's education records. These procedures include the method of determining fees for copies, a listing of the locations of these education records, and the identity of the individuals in charge of the records.
 - c. It establishes procedures and regulations to allow parents or students to request the amendment of a student's education records

to ensure that the records are not inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy or other rights.

- d. It establishes procedures and regulations for access to and disclosure of education records.
- e. It establishes procedures and regulations for safeguarding the privacy of education records and for obtaining prior written consent of the parent or student when required prior to disclosure.

"Directory information" will be included in a student directory and will include the following information relating to a student: the student's name; address; telephone number; email address; skype username; participation in officially recognized activities and sports; weight and height of members of athletic teams; dates of attendance; and other similar information. "Directory information" does not include identifying information on a student's religion, race, color, social position or nationality.

The information listed above shall be public information that the school may disclose from the education records of a student. Should the parent of a student or the student so desire, any or all of the listed information will not be disclosed without the parent's or eligible student's prior written consent, except to school officials as provided under federal law. In order to make any or all of the directory information listed above "private," the parent or eligible student must sign the on the "opt out" space on the preschool conference form: "Permissions," or make a written request to the student's advisor within thirty (30) days of receiving this information.

Wording on Permissions document: ""Directory information" publically available includes: the student's name; address; telephone number; email address; Skype username; date and place of birth; major field of study; participation in officially recognized activities and sports; weight and height of members of athletic teams; dates of attendance; degrees and awards received; the most recent educational agency or institution attended by the student; and other similar information SIGN IF YOU DO NOT WANT THIS INFORMATION AVAILABLE.
