Verdigris

Have you ever seen a penny with a green edge, or wondered about the green sheen on the Statue of Liberty? That beautiful blue-green patina (a top layer or film) is called verdigris. The word comes from French words meaning "Green of Greece." Some metals, including copper, can change color because of natural chemical reactions. It takes time, though - The Statue of Liberty spent 30 years transforming from brownish copper to green!
