Course Overview:

The English Language Arts Curriculum is built upon the expectation that students will engage in broad reading and writing experiences which encompass literary texts, non-fiction and other informational texts as well as film and visual texts. Synopses of Novels:

Snow Falling on Cedars~ a novel of the trial of a Japanese American charged with the murder of a local fisherman on the Island of San Piedro, Washington. The novel presents a mix of courtroom drama and romance in the wake of the troubling policies against Japanese Americans after World War II, and how this affects a small community.

The Kite Runner~ a novel of the friendship of two boys growing up together yet very differently in Afghanistan. It is a novel of betrayal, guilt, forgiveness and love, set with the background of all the recent events in Afghanistan. The novel includes brief violence and inappropriate language.

Kaffir Boy~ an autobiographical account of the brutalities and difficulties of growing up under the South African apartheid system, and one boy's account of trying to escape.

Night~a Holocaust (WWII) memoir with various scenes of cruelty and violence.

1984~ a dystopian novel about government control of all aspects of life. The imaginary world of 1984 illustrates the dangers of a totalitarian society on its citizens.

And Then There Were None-A mystery novel set in England involving the mysterious bringing together of ten strangers to a remote island, and one by one, the ten begin to disappear or found dead.

The Kite Runner- a novel of the friendship of two boys growing up together yet very differently in Afghanistan. It is a novel of betrayal, guilt, forgiveness and love, set with the background of all the recent events in Afghanistan. The novel includes brief violence and inappropriate language.

A Stranger is Watching-a suspense novel set in NYC in a race against time to stop a serial killer from killing again and bombing Grand Central Station.
