## **IISD Trustees Outline Proposed Improvements to District**

At the April IISD Board of Trustees meeting, the members reviewed a power point that outlined needed improvements for the district, which will be made if the \$6 million bond passes in the Itasca ISD Bond Election on May 8, 2010.



Listed and illustrated were the projects deemed priorities and feasible with the bond. Because of today's low interest rates, the district will get more "bang for its buck" and will be able to renovate the cafeteria, remove the old junior high and add a new elementary addition in the area. A high school addition, new fine arts building, relocating the bus facility in order to re-route drop off and pick up of middle school students are also included in the plans.

If the bond passes, the timeline for the proposed improvements would start this summer and all areas would be completed by the beginning of the 2011-2012 school year.

# Two Arrests in Child Injury Cases

Information from The Reporter

Two arrests were made Wednesday, April 14, by the Itasca Police Department in connection with an injury to a child investigation that has been ongoing since December.

According to Lieutenant Winston Brewer, the investigation was initiated December 27 after a picture of a baby with a black eye showed up on a MySpace page. Child Protective Services (CPS) was notified, and authorities went to a Wall Street residence. The three-month-old child was taken by ambulance to Cook Children's Hospital in Fort Worth for treatment of what medical officials identified as non-medical injuries.

The child was placed with relatives following a CPS investigation, the lieutenant said. Arraigned on charges of injury to a child were Zoleeta Myers-West, 20, and John Olivas, 19, both of Itasca. Bonds were set at \$10,000 each by Justice of the Peace John Milburn. According to Brewer, additional charges may be filed in connection with the case, plus there may be more arrests.

And during the period early voting is required or permitted by law, being April 26, 2010 through May 4, 2010, the hours designated for early voting by personal appearance shall be from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on each day except Saturdays, Sundays and legal state holidays; and the early voting clerk shall keep said early voting place open during such hours for early voting by personal appearance. The early voting clerk for said election shall be Norma Merkel.


