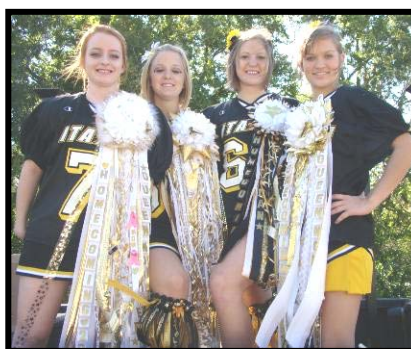

County Fair Dates Set for 2011

The Hill County Ag Youth, Inc. Board of Directors recently held its annual meeting and set the dates for the 2011 Hill County Fair. It will remain the last week in January, running from Wednesday, January 26, through Saturday, January 29.

Re-elected to serve two-year terms on the board from the various justice of the peace precincts were Charlie French of Blum, Nick Pustejovsky of Abbott and Jack Ward of Hubbard. Newcomer on the board will be Craig Morris of Covington. Appointed members coming onto the board include Penny Sumrall representing creative arts and education and Lloyd Warren representing 4-H.

In the financial report, proceeds from the sale in the livestock division were up just over \$50,000, going from \$208,730 in 2009 to \$259,315 in January. Livestock Superintendent Curtis Thompson expressed appreciation to those individuals and businesses who came out to support the youth of the county by bidding on their projects.

Other than the addition of several classes in the rabbit division, there were no major rules changes in the livestock division. Terri Pustejovsky has taken over as chair of the Creative Arts and Education Division. She is currently recruiting volunteers to assist with next year's fair and may be contacted by calling 254-582-0689. The board approved the purchase of new chicken and rabbit pens.

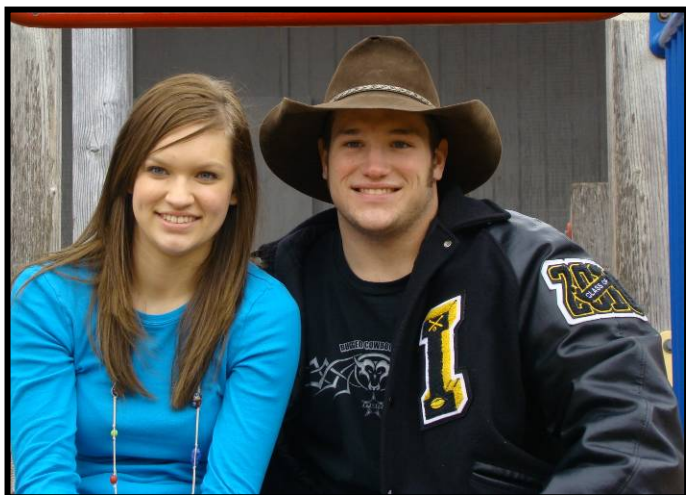

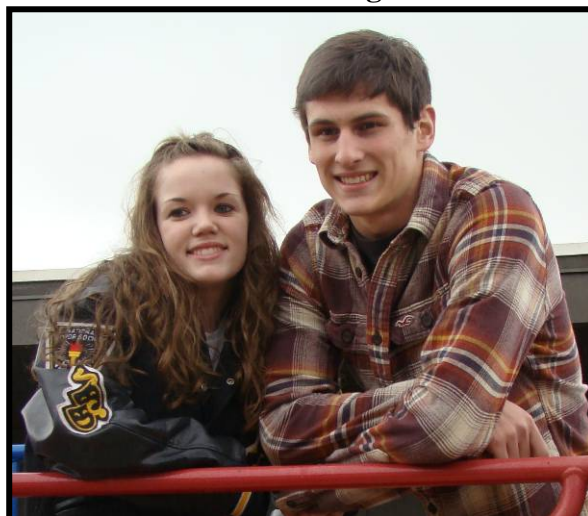

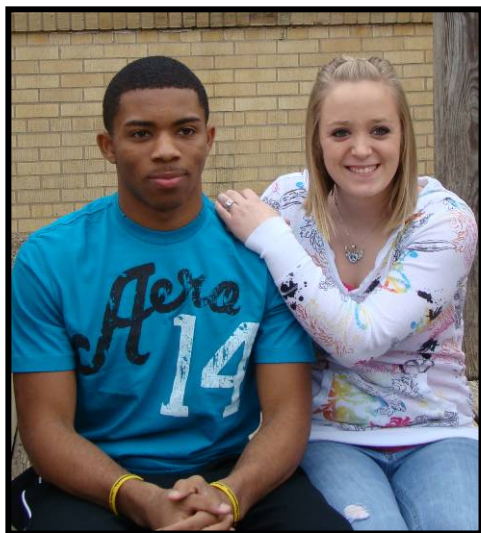
