
Mr. McKim graduated from Lincol High School in Ellwood City, Pennsylvania. East Palestine is his

Coach Sansenbaugher believes the team


is working hard and is looking for combinations that click. When preparing for a game the team talks about the defense of the other team and what they can do to use that information to their advantages.
