
Recent News

Financial Update

Our budget for this coming year is based on a student population of 200. Currently the school has 200 students enrolled with 9 more in the registration process. While we do seem on pace to garner 200+ students and to maintain the budget, please continue to pray that God will direct families and students to DCS.

Due to your involvement, DCS has been able to make advancements in our instruction for this year and looks to the future to provide an even better education for our students.

THIS YEAR: Through grants and your generous giving during past auctions, DCS was able to make several technological and safety upgrades this past year. Such improvements include the following: the server, firewall and switches, Wi-Fi capabilities, students machines (20 iPads, 30 Chromebooks with cart, and new computers for the computer lab), security cameras, a card-locking system, rekeying the facility, new classroom furniture for students, and a variety of classroom specific materials. As stated earlier, these items were all purchased because of grants and generous giving during school auctions. Thank you!

FOR THE FUTURE: The church elders, who serve as the school board, assessed the condition of our facilities in the context of the numerous ministries DCC facilitates. It has become clearly apparent that we need to look at making some serious upgrades to our facilities. In October, the vision for these upgrades and changes will be shared with church and school families. We would appreciate your prayers for wisdom as we anticipate moving forward with a building project.

Outreach Opportunities

<u>LIVING CLASSROOMS</u>: This fall, our 9th-12th graders will participate in Living Classrooms, a week filled with unique activities that allow for experiential learning. Freshmen will learn about Native Americans and visit Warm Springs, volunteering at a Baptist church on the reservation. Similarly, sophomores will be learning about the armed forces at Camp Withycombe, working with AMEN Ministries, who serves our local veterans and their families. Our 11th and 12th grades will make their annual trips to Washington D.C. and Yellowstone. Please pray for travel mercies for all our groups and for their witness as they have opportunities to serve as the visible presence of Christ to those they interact with.

ADDITIONAL SCHOOL WORKDAY: Please join other DCC and DCS families at our second All-School Work Day (October 1st) from 8:30 A.M. to 3:00 P.M.
