competing in 60-second competitions as DCS culminated a month of gathering pledges with games and an auction. In total, the event was a huge success as we were able to raise over \$30,000 for curriculum, furniture and other resources to address our aging building and curriculum needs. A big thank you goes to Mrs. Herdener for organizing this fun event, Ms. Rossos for providing a tasty buffet dinner, and to each and every one of you, who generously gave and supported our school ministry.



At the auction, those in attendance also viewed a quick presentation that shared the benefits of past auctions. For instance, significant upgrades to campus security have been made this year, including replacing our outdated



cameras with new hi-def cameras, a video-buzz in system and magnetic locks with card swipe access. In addition, technology improvements include upgraded servers, Wi-Fi, iPads and Chromebooks, purchased with auction funds and the Juan Young Trust grant. Last, attenders were introduced to plans for a new three-story building, which would contain all DCS classrooms.

MRS. KLINGBILE'S RETIREMENT: On April 25<sup>th</sup>, the auditorium was filled with students, staff and friends and family of Mrs. Klingbile. #### Reflections from the Principal: Zachary Davidson



After concluding my first year as principal at Damascus Christian School, I have humbly come away with two observations. Damascus Christian has a strong family culture and an unwavering commitment to teaching from a Biblical worldview.

First, our family culture is apparent in observed interactions sprinkled throughout my day. Last month, I observed a junior student kneeling down to attentively listen to a third grader describe her state project. This past week, I witnessed a teacher meeting with a student in the sanctuary and interceding for them in prayer. Yesterday, I watched elementary students be entertained as high school students practiced for a skit. These interactions between students and also between students and staff are a beautiful thing,

which cultivate unique opportunities for mentoring and discipleship. This family environment is one of the many attributes of DCS I have enjoyed watching and definitely something we do really well here.

Second, our strong commitment to a Biblical Worldview is paramount to everything we do. While many other Christian schools have adopted secular curriculum and chased various initiatives, we have held resolute to not compromise the Bible, which serves as our foundation. I have appreciated DCC as a church, our school and our many families that realize that Biblically founded education is a priority. Consequently, I am strengthening our efforts to involve students in discipleship and outreach opportunities.

### **Sport and Extra-Curricular Highlights**

<u>JH Track Recap</u>: The 2016 middle school season had many highlights, one being the mere turnout for the team. We had a total of fourteen athletes half of which will be returning next year. Another highlight was heading home from meets with boys and girls teams always placing high in meets in the team scoring. Both boys and girls placed fifth overall at districts. We had a wonderful season full of personal records and outstanding performances. I am very proud to have been able to coach such a talented and fun group of Damascus student athletes. — Coach Juan

High School Track Recap: This year was a very challenging year. We had several athletes that were injured and several athletes sick at the beginning of the season. It took some time for everyone to get healthy. The great thing about this year's team is they worked through it. The true sign of a great team is how it handles adversity. They handled it very well. This year was a total team effort. Every single Athlete on the boys and girls team contributed at Districts. This year we had 37 personal records set.



- **HS Girls Team:** The girls repeated as district champions. This was truly amazing. The girls' team only consisted of six athletes. The entire girls team competed at state. Faith Richards placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 1500 meters and 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 800 meters. Nicole Manning placed 5<sup>th</sup> in the javelin and 3rd in shot put. Ashlynn Jones placed 10th in the long jump and 10<sup>th</sup> in the triple jump. The girls' 4x100 relay placed 7<sup>th</sup> and again placed in the 4x400 relay (6<sup>th</sup> place). In the overall team competition, the girls' team placed 5<sup>th</sup> in state. What an amazing six girls... they left it all on track.
- **HS Boys Team:** The boys' team placed 2<sup>nd</sup> at districts, sending 6 athletes to state. Moses Wakefield placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in state in the 3000 meter run breaking his own school record by 17 seconds. Moses also placed 4<sup>th</sup> in the 1500 meter run. Hunter Straub placed 8<sup>th</sup> in the long jump and 6<sup>th</sup> in the triple jump. Ben

Shields and Hunter Straub also placed 12<sup>th</sup> in the pole vault. Micah Gandara placed 10<sup>th</sup> in the boys 800 meters. The boys' 4x400 meter relay team placed 10<sup>th</sup>.

This year was a lot of fun everyone competed hard and improved every day. I would like to say thank you to the Seniors Hunter Straub, Ben shields, Emily Bedlion, Hanna Betsacon, Monty Phillips, and our two amazing exchange students—Juan Serralls and Davide Riboldi.
