#### He is Risen Indeed!



## **Financial Update**


**FINACIAL REPORT**: My job as the school administrator is to provide students an excellent education from a Biblical Worldview, a variety of extra-curricular activities, and meaningful spiritual development. I am tasked with offering this at a cost that is commensurate with other Christian schools in our area.

I have found this to be a delicate balancing act and even a step of faith as I seek to keep to our mission, provide our staff a professional wage, offer a variety of elective and co-curricular activities, maintain our accreditation, and provide staff proper resources and students sufficient facilities.

To maintain clear communication, I have included a pie chart below, depicting how our 1.1 million dollar budget is allocated. As you can see, most dollars are fixed, which free up only a minute margin of funds to be creative with. Despite the limitations, we are able to make big changes in the programs we offer. Please read the next section to see the exciting new opportunities we are putting into place for next year.

### **School Budget:**

- Staff Salaries 85%
- Staff Benefits 11%
- Extra Curricular .4%
- Books and Fees .6%
- Utilities .8%
- Supplies and Other 2.2%



**EXCITING NEW OPPORTUNITIES**: After careful deliberation, prayer and seeking counsel, I am excited to share the following information concerning our tuition and programs for 2016-2017.

- 1) We will not be raising tuition next fall as we seek to remain competitive in our market.
- 2) We are excited to be offering the following classes next year: Physics, Foods/Home Economics, Criminal Justice, Shop and more advanced computer classes.
- 3) We are also excited to be implementing honor classes in our core classes next year.
- 4) We are also pursuing dual credit offerings with local colleges, who will allow us to maintain our Biblical Worldview.
- 5) Finally, we are requesting you as parents to join a group of teachers, elders and other stake holders in the school as we seek to develop our Continuous Improvement Plan. This will require a commitment of one Saturday and two or three evenings over the summer. We seek to create plans for the future along with the plans to accomplish them. **FACTS – TUITION ASSISTANCE:** Our school is blessed to have financial resources to come along side parents.



We can provide tuition assistance through scholarships for families, who struggle to afford Damascus Christian School. This past year, twenty families were awarded scholarships. While we do have limitations to the number of families we can help, I would like to encourage those who need financial assistance to visit our website and submit an application with FACTS, an outside organization that helps us determine how to best meet the financial needs of the applicants. This is a confidential process. Applications must be submitted by April 30<sup>th</sup> to be considered for tuition assistance next year.

**KEATON COFFEY SCHOLARSHIP:** Applications are available for  $7^{th} - 11^{th}$  Graders for DCS students who have a heart for & participate in service-oriented, extracurricular activities are encouraged to apply for this scholarship. Applications are due April  $15^{th}$ .


## **Outreach Opportunities**
