Mr. Dick Lehman, Elementary Principal, reported that the Foreign Language Club has started offering Chinese, Japanese, Spanish, and Arabic. The University of Findlay sends students to our school during the students recess time at lunch to work with those interested in a language. The second grade students will begin working with a University of Findlay student with their reading mentoring program. They come to our students for a half hour twice a week for four weeks. They culminate their program by inviting students to break fast at the University followed by visits to the Mazza Gallery, Planetarium, and science center. This has been an excellent program for both the University and our students. Other activities include a second grade math night, kindergarten screening, spring pictures, tornado drills, a family literacy night, a star lab assembly, and the last VBEPA movie night.

Mr. Jay Clark, Middle School Principal, reported that Mr. Trace Roth and his daughter Sara spoke to the sixth graders about life in Haiti. The Roths have traveled to Haiti as part of a mission trip and had a number of pictures showing students the lives of Haitians. The sixth graders collected items to assist in the relief efforts. The middle school will have three fundraisers throughout March to help with earthquake relief in Haiti. Funds donated to "Students Rebuild" will help rebuild schools in Haiti. Throughout the course of this school year, we have piloted a math intervention/enrichment program called ALEKS with at-risk math students in the middle school. We have also received a grant to pilot fifty student licenses for Reading Plus. Reading Plus has many of the advantages of ALEKS, such as individualized learning for all levels of students and may help fill a critical gap with adolescent literacy.

Mr. Mike Brand, High School Principal, reported that the Ohio Graduation Test (OGT) will be taken during the week of March 15. The test will be taken by all of our sophomores and a few juniors and seniors who have not passed the OGT. An assembly was held on March 10 for all high school and middle school students and featured Devin Wyman who spoke on the topic "Helping our Youth Make the Right Choices Today for a Better Tomorrow". Mr. Wyman played his college football career at Kentucky State University and was drafted into the NFL by the New England Patriots and also played for the Minnesota Vikings and Kansas City Chiefs. The assembly was well received by students and staff.

Mr. Tim Myers, Superintendent, reported that a current update of progress on the strategic plan is available on line. He also reviewed the current abated property in the Van Buren School District as discussed at the February meeting of the Tax Incentive Review Council. Mr. Myers also discussed our current three year contract for insurance with Ohio Casualty through Huntington Insurance expires this year. We have been extremely happy and satisfied with the coverage and quality service that Huntington Insurance has provided us throughout this agreement. They are anticipating a 3-5% decline in this year's overall premium and are offering a three year rate guarantee with our renewal. An appraisal will also be done by Ohio Casualty at no cost to the district. A new contract will be brought to the board for approval at a later date.
