Board member, Ken Rowles, joined the meeting via conference call at 7:12 P.M.

Mr. Dick Lehman, Elementary Principal, reported that 49 new students were enrolled which is twice the number we usually have. Keyboarding instruction for the third grade will continue this year twice a week and teachers will continue with another practice day. The fourth grade will continue with one day per week instruction and another practice day with their teachers. The reading section of the achievement test will be given to all third graders on October 4. This will be followed by the cognitive ability tests and Iowa tests.

Mr. Jay Clark, Middle School Principal, reported that the seventh grade Latin video distance learning course registration filled to capacity within the first few hours of the first day of school. Mrs. Mary Jo Behrensmeyer at Mount Vernon City Schools is doing an excellent job teaching the course. This course will be featured at the Ohio Classical Conference in mid-October, a gathering of Ohio's Latin teachers and professors. Distribution of the student netbooks will begin on September 14 to the eighth graders, seventh grade on September 28 and sixth grade on October 12.

Mr. Mike Brand, High School Principal, reported that high school grade levels participated in class meetings the first week of school. These meetings included the principal reviewing and presenting changes to the student handbook and the guidance counselor reviewed information appropriate to each grade level. The freshman mentoring program is up and going with the freshman students meeting with their mentors at Opening Knight and were given insight as to what to expect the first few days of school. The mentors also planned and held a freshman mentoring field day where the freshman students did team building activities led by mentors and teacher mentor leaders.

Mr. Tim Myers, Superintendent, reported that the building study usage by RCM architects is progressing and Mr. Myers will meet with them so that they can move forward to their next portion of the study. It was also reported that Van Buren School was rated "Excellent" by ODE again. The unofficial enrollment count for this year is 1038, an increase of 28 students over last year. Capitol Conference is coming up in November and the middle school will be presenting a program at the Student Achievement Fair.
