Message from the Principal

On behalf of the administrative team and staff of Marysville Pilchuck High School I want to share with you how excited we are to welcome in the 2019-20 school year. We have had a busy summer of re-siding, cleaning and readying our buildings for our students to return. Please note as you prepare for school this year that our freshman class and Link Crew will be attending school on September 4th, and our sophomores, juniors and seniors will start school on the 5th. Transportation and food services will start as normal on the 4th. You will receive information from the Marysville School District regarding the calendar and bell schedule for this year and you will see that we are returning to early release Professional Growth Fridays again this year.

As the new principal of MPHS I would like to extend you an invitation to come with your student to Tomahawk Day (August 21, 11-7PM) to meet with me in an informal setting. School Bus Routes

Cell Phone Policy

We have a change in our cell phone policy for high school students that begins September 4th. All MPHS classrooms will be cell phone free zones. This means that all cell phones should remain in off or in silent mode, and in your student's backpack or in a teacher provided storage location for the entire class period in all classes.

Students will have a cell phone policy in their student handbooks which will be available on the school website. This information will be provided to students when we return from summer break.

As a technology forward school, MPHS staff want to help teach and promote appropriate digital citizenship. Our school staff have overwhelm-

ingly agreed that a consistent and school wide policy to bar cell phone use during class time will help students stay more present and engaged in their learning.

For parents and guardians, we ask

that you please help to promote this policy by restricting phone contact

with your student to before or after school, during passing periods or during lunch, when cell phone use will be allowed. We ask that

families and students use the main office when communicating messages from home or school.

Dress Code

Dress restrictions are imposed when they relate to intimidating behaviors or interfere with the learning of others. (*Please refer to our student* handbook for the complete dress code)

 process.
- No clothing or jewelry that advertises or depicts drugs, tobacco products, or alcohol.
- Anything else that MSD administrators or security personnel consider gang related will not be worn or displayed in any manner.

Chromebooks

trict-issued devices safe, secure and in good working order.

Each student must
return the MSD 1:1
Technology Use and
Safety Agreement
signed by parent/
guardian prior to receiving a
Chromebook. This form and the
optional Chromebook insurance
form will be provided to students
and may also be found on the MDS
website. Chromebook insurance is
available for purchase through our

cashier's office and our online store.

Students are expected to bring their device to school each day with a full charge. They will communicate responsibly and ethically using school appropriate language and speech.

Marysville School District Excused Absence Info

Excused absences

Absences due to the following reasons can be excused:

- ♦ Illness, health condition or medical appointment
- ♦ Family emergency
- ♦ Religious or cultural
- ♦ Court, judicial proceeding, court-ordered activity, or jury service
- ♦ Post-secondary, technical school or apprenticeship program visitation, or scholarship interview
- ♦ State-recognized search and rescue activities consistent with RCW <u>28A.225.055</u>;
- ♦ Absence directly related to the student's homeless or foster care/dependency status;
- ♦ Absences related to deployment activities of a parent or legal guardian who is an active duty member consistent with RCW28A.705.010;
- ♦ Absences due to suspensions, expulsions or emergency expulsions imposed pursuant to chapter <u>392-400</u> WAC if the student is not receiving educational services and is not enrolled in qualifying "course of study" activities as defined in WAC <u>392-121-107</u>;
- ♦ Absences due to student safety concerns, including absences related to threats, assaults, or bullying;
- ♦ Absences due to a student's migrant status

A school principal or designee <u>has the authority to determine if an absence meets the above criteria for an excused absence</u>. Districts may define additional categories or criteria for excused absences.

Unexcused absences

Any absence from school is unexcused unless it meets one of the criteria provided above WAC $\underline{392\text{-}401\text{-}}$ $\underline{020}$.

When you are absent a parent/guardian has three days to report the absence or it will remain as "<u>Unexcused</u>".


