Our audit deficiencies have been rectified and other recent allegations that have been successfully remediated.

Student safety is a priority that is always at the forefront of our charge as educators. All staff members are trained and retrained on all aspects of student safety, both physical and emotional. Bullying and abuse are current buzz words that can evoke a myriad of responses and connotations. Acts of horse play, while never condoned, take on a much more serious connotation in today's educational environment. Every incident that is observed and reported is handled with the utmost concern for the student's safety.


Coaches, teachers, and other staff members can't be in two places at once or everywhere at all times. Students, staff, parents, and community members can help us by informing us immediately of any unwelcome acts either observed or directed at them. The quicker we know, the faster we can investigate and ensure the physical and emotional safety of all. Only by being made aware of any unwelcome acts from as little as minor horse play that may or may not meet the definition of bullying to more intense situations can we act quickly and appropriately lessening the effect of such actions and protecting the well-being of all students. Ongoing training for both students and staff in these areas will continue and expand. One person's idea of fun may be very uncomfortable for another.

I will continue to monitor the biennial budget and its effects on our finances. The tangible personal property tax reimbursement is a significant concern for us. Just recently, I received an engineering study which the Board authorized following the Bond Levy defeat last November. The Board will be reviewing this report. Hopefully, I will be able to report more on these issues in our June, year-end edition of the *Knightly News*.

As always, please contact me with concerns, thoughts, and ideas in regards to your Van Buren Schools. I am always happy to hear your concerns, answer questions, and provide additional facts and details to rumors you may hear. I know that there are thoughts and ideas in the community that could help to make us better. Perhaps I can help you to understand why or why not something was done. I am always looking for opportunities to promote, communicate, and expound on the virtues and successes of the Van Buren Schools. I would be happy to attend any event, large or small, formal or informal, to discuss our Van Buren Schools.

Students, grades 9-11, are required to take final exams. With parental permission received one week prior to the start of final exams (Wednesday, May 20, 2015), high school students may report each day for their first exam of the day and remain in school until their last exam period of the day is completed, at which time, with parental permission, they may sign out in the high school office. IMPORTANT: Students will not be permitted to come to school for an exam, leave school and then return to take an exam scheduled later in the day. Once a student is here for exams, he/she will stay until his/her last exam period of the day is completed. Students leaving the building during the school day will not be permitted to re-enter to take an exam scheduled later in the day. Students not in exams must report to study hall.

During exam days, students who arrive after 7:50 A.M. must sign in at the cafeteria when arriving and have presented (by Wednesday, May 20, 2015) a parent

signed form authorizing the late arrival. After signing in, all students will remain in the cafeteria until the end of the period. Students are not permitted anywhere in the building, other than the cafeteria during an exam period. Students may not go to their lockers during an exam period since this could be disruptive to other students taking exams.

Morning attendance will be taken during the first period exam of each day. Students scheduled for an exam, but not present, will be reported to the office. Students are required to be prepared and ready for their exam prior to the start of the exam. Students tardy to an exam must have a pass from the office before being permitted to take the exam.

Students with schedule conflicts such as Millstream and Post-Secondary Options may reschedule an exam with the teacher. All other exams are to be taken during the scheduled times.






Van Buren Students Successful at Millstream Career Center Competitions

News from the Hancock County Health Department

It is once again time to start thinking about vaccinating your children for the upcoming school year. Any child entering kindergarten or 7th grade will need vaccine updates before the start of the 2015-2016 school year to be in compliance with the Ohio Revised Code guidelines. Tdap is required for the students entering the 7th. We continue to be concerned about the resurgence of pertussis (whooping cough) which is the reason for the Tdap requirement. Along with the Tdap vaccine, we would encourage you to consider the meningitis and chickenpox vaccines for any child age 11 through 18. These vaccines are available at most physician's offices or here at the Hancock County Health Department. The Hancock County Health Department is now a vaccine provider from most local insurance companies and bill insurance for services provided. If you are interested in scheduling for vaccinations at our office please call 419-424-7869. I would strongly encourage you to call and get these scheduled now. Please don't wait until August as our clinics are usually filled to capacity.




