Information Videos, School and Community Safety, Springtime By Tim Myers, Superintendent

In the last newsletter I talked about a regular video message that I was going to start producing for the staff and community. I have created a page on the district's web site called the "Superintendent's Corner". You can find this page by going to the web site http://vbschools.net and clicking on the Quick Links in the upper right hand corner. Videos and other district news and notes will be found on this page. The videos will also be uploaded to the district's Facebook page. The first video was available late in February. There is another video from me and one from the Board of Education planned for March.

Every year the administrative team reviews our district safety plans. The incident in Florida and the actions that the shooter took brings up questions about our plan. We will be meeting in March with the local first responders and make any necessary adjustments to our plan. Student safety is a high priority in our district.

Even with our safety plan, the Boot, our emergency radios, and other protections that we have put in place, history shows us that determined individual(s) may be hard to stop. Our intent is to do everything that we can to delay an intruder, keep them out of our buildings, and train students and staff on best practices to keep everyone as safe as possible.

The school district is partnering with the Village of Van Buren and Hancock County Sheriff's Department by hosting a Home Safety Seminar in our auditorium on Wednesday, March 28, at 7:00 PM. The presentation will be called C.R.A.S.E (Citizen Response to Active Shooter Event). The C.R.A.S.E. course will provide you with a brief overview of active shooters in the USA and what you could do if an active shooter is present at your place of business, home, or any other place you may be at!! I invite all staff and community members to this important presentation.



Poetry Out Loud School Champion Crowned



On January 25, the English department awarded senior Autumn Pisarsky with the title of Poetry Out Loud school champion, which propelled her to the regional contest held February 20 at the Marathon Center for the Performing Arts.

Poetry Out Loud, which The National Endowment for the Arts and Poetry Foundation sponsor, allows students to

present poems at school, regional, state, and national levels in an attempt to earn the \$20,000 grand prize.

Three students, Pisarsky, senior Alex Godzak, and junior Lilly Saum, met during Wednesday activity periods from November through January to work on their poems, but students had to do most of the work on their own time. While it might seem that memorization would be the only requirement for this contest, students were also judged on their physical presence, voice and articulation, dramatic appropriateness, evidence of understanding, and overall performance.

The contest was held in the auditorium and consisted of two rounds. The poems students presented came from the Poetry Out Loud anthology, and at least one poem had to be less than 25 lines and pre-20th century (or meeting those two criteria could be spread across the two poems).

At the Northwest/Toledo regional contest, Pisarsky faced five other contestants as she attempted to advance to the state competition in Columbus. She presented her poems, "The Significance of Location" by Pattiann Rogers and "As Kingfishers Catch Fire" by Gerard Manley Hopkins, to a crowd of approximately 50 people, but presenters from Lima Central Catholic and Toledo School for the Arts were declared the regional winners.

The English teachers are proud of how Autumn, Alex, and Lilly represented Van Buren throughout the preparation and contest and hope even more students will participate next year. If you know of someone who might be interested, please encourage them to get involved.


Engineers Meet with Students

Learning to Do, Doing to Learn

Students in the agricultural education classes have a lot of opportunities around them. Currently, we are raising Netherland Dwarf and Lionhead Rabbits, as well as a batch of broiler chickens, a flock of laying hens, and two ducks! All of these animals serve different purposes. Our rabbits, are being raised by students to help them with their SAEs. SAEs are a Supervised Agricultural Experience in which students are required to have, and it can help them earn awards such a State FFA Degree, an American FFA Degree, and even Proficiency Awards. The students are breeding and raising the rabbits and selling them as 4-H projects, FFA projects, and pets. Some of our students will even show them at the Hancock Co. Fair this summer! We currently have seven lionhead bunnies available.

As for the chickens, we are raising the broilers to learn about how poultry processing works and comparing their growth to our laying hens. Students will be able to help from start to finish in the process, and see how we get eggs and our poultry products. The ducks are projects we are trying to see if students are interested in raising them for the fair.

The ag students are responsible for 100% of the care and maintenance of these animals. That includes things such as grooming, nail trimming, checking weights, feed and watering, and changing out bedding. Here in the Ag Education Classroom, we believe the best way to learn is by doing.




Youth Art Month Show




