Sangamo JV Football Game Rules:

- At the junior varsity level of football competition, quarters will consist of twelve minutes and the score reset after halftime.
- The schools may only allow freshmen, sophomores or junior athletes to participate in the following manner:
 - 1 st quarter- freshmen, sophomores, juniors
 - 2 nd quarter- freshmen, sophomores, juniors
 - 3 rd quarter- - freshmen, sophomores
 - 4 th quarter- freshmen, sophomores (sophomores should be used in only cases to fill team ex. fill a certain position or allow for substitutions).

Beginning in the 2019-20 school year, football teams are required to follow this language in IHSAA Policy 13 regarding an individual player's participation limits.

Individual players may participate in a maximum of two games per week (Friday-Thursday).

It is recommended that if a player participates in two games in a week, one of those games is only as a one-way player.

Individual players are not allowed to participate in two games on the same day or in games on consecutive days.

Schools can still schedule two games on a Friday or on a Saturday. However, an individual player is not allowed to participate in two games on the same day.

For example, on a Friday: Freshman game at 5:00; Varsity game at 7:30

For example, on a Saturday: Freshman A game at 10:00; Freshman B game at 12:30

If a school plays its Freshman games on Thursday, a Freshman player is not allowed to participate in the Freshman game on Thursday and in the Varsity game on Friday.

If a school plays its Sophomore or JV games on Saturday, an individual player is not allowed to participate in the Varsity game on Friday and in the Sophomore or JV game on Saturday.

Individual players are not allowed to participate in live contact or Thud in practice the day before or after participating in a game.

If a school plays a JV or Sophomore game on Monday, the players who participated in that game are allowed to practice on Tuesday. They can wear full pads. They can hit a sled. They can tackle dummies or bags. They can hold a shield. They can participate in conditioning drills.

They are not allowed to be involved in live contact or Thud at Tuesday's practice.

Thud: *Drill is run at full speed through the moment of contact. There is no pre-determined "winner". Contact is above the waist, players stay on their feet, and a quick whistle ends the drill.*

Special Teams players who only kick, punt, or hold for extra-point kicks and field goals are allowed to play in two games on the same day or in games on consecutive days.

For example: A Freshman kicker/punter is allowed to play in a Varsity game on Friday night and in a JV, Sophomore, or Freshman game on Saturday, as long as he only participates as a kicker/punter in both games.

Participating in one play counts as participating in a game.

This means that a player who participates in at least one play in a Varsity game on Friday night is not allowed to play in a game on Thursday or Saturday.

If a player participates in one play due to a teammate's equipment failure or injury, that play doesn't count as participation in that game.

In situations where a game starts on one day and is delayed to the next day due to weather or other circumstances, players who participated in the portion of the game on the first day are allowed to participate in the resumed portion of the game the following day.

- ★ Registration was well attended. Current enrollments are:
 - Kindergarten - 77
 - 1st Grade - 79
 - 2nd Grade - 74
- ★ Construction work has been 98% completed. The only items left are some work on the doors and painting lines on the gym floor. The painting is scheduled for this Friday.
- ★ There was a large crowd for Back-To-School night with 80-90% attendance reported by most teachers. Many families enjoyed the photo booth we set up for pictures.
