
MSAD 49 2019-2020 Budget Information

Proposed 2019-2020 Budget Increase: 2.34%






Note - Career and Technical Education, like Mid-Maine Technical Center, is now funded directly by the State. Municipalities will only be asked to contribute for specific items. The MMTC Board did not request any additional funding for 2019-2020.

The Department of Education calculates the total cost of Kindergarten through grade 12 education to be \$2.52 billion in 2019-20. (PL19, Chapter 343, Part C)

This recognizes a 3.49% cost increase over the current year (PL17, Chapter 446).

The proposed budget includes:

- 1 Reading Recovery position

- 1 Nurse
- Continues 12 positions added during 2018-19
- Funding for LHS and LJHS principal positions

The proposed **Title I** budget includes:

- 6 Reading Recovery positions
- Pre-K at Fairfield Primary, Clinton and Albion
- Funding to serve homeless students
