Mission Statement



HISTORY

Futures Unlimited was created by the Regional Office of Education as a GED program in an upstairs room at the downtown post office in 1978. At that time Futures had one staff person and approximately 15 students.

Futures expanded greatly in 1985 as a result of a State initiative designed to prevent truancy and to serve "at risk" students.

In 1991, Futures moved to 250 E. William St. in downtown Decatur.

In 2016, Futures moved to its present location in the Tech Center at 300 E. Eldorado St.

Futures Unlimited currently employs 12 faculty and staff members. Futures Unlimited also provides services for approximately 170 students per year in our Special Education program and High School program.

TEACHING PHILOSOPHY

Futures Unlimited teachers have a clear understanding of the term "Teaching." The following philosophy of the teaching/learning activities represents the principal obligations of all Futures teachers.

- Ordered Learning the curriculum and syllabus based on student needs.
- <u>Planned Learning</u> matter, method, materials based on needs, develop worthwhile learning activities.

- <u>Guided Learning</u> stimulate students, individualized instruction, Individualized Education Plans, student participation, guided real life learning experiences.
- Interactive learning with studentsbuild rapport between students and teachers leading to better student adjustments, relationships, and understanding.
- Evaluating student's progress keeping accurate cumulative records.
- Communication with parentsguardians - knowing and understanding the student and his/her environment.
- <u>Interaction with colleagues</u> in school, at staff meetings, at in-service sessions and seminars.
- <u>Learning and growing</u> teachers and students.

QUALIFICATIONS AND ADMISSION

Admission is open to any student in high school who meets the minimum age requirement of sixteen. All students must be referred to Futures Unlimited by their home school district. The home district will provide a copy of the school transcript and letter of referral.

Each student being considered for enrollment at Futures Unlimited must undergo an assessment. The purpose is to determine a student's goals, abilities and vocational interests. During this assessment, background information is gathered and reading and math abilities are determined. With the results of these assessments, an appropriate individual program is planned.
