
Highlights from the School Counselor 6th Grade Career Day!



SUMMER FOOD PROGRAM

Summer is an exciting time for children to enjoy time with friends, a week at camp, a family vacation, or time at the pool. But for many children who receive free and reduced-price meals at school, summer can mean hunger. Just as learning does not end when school lets out, neither does a child's need for good nutrition.

The Summer Food Service Program, administered by the Iowa Department of Education, provides nutritious meals and snacks to children in low-income areas during the summer months. There are many summer food service program feedings sites across the state of Iowa; however the program is still vastly under-utilized. The biggest barrier to children participating in the Summer Food Service Program is knowledge that feedings sites exist.

Delwood PTO surveyed current 5th and 6th grade Delwood students, as well as a significant portion of Maguoketa Middle School students (6th through 8th grades). We were looking for feedback and input directly from the students in regard to what apps they most regularly use and for what purposes. Some basic trends we found include cell phones becoming common within the 6th grade year and over 90% of 7th and 8th graders having phones. This means regular access to the internet and apps is right in their back pockets! For social apps, Snapchat is the most commonly used, with Instagram next most popular. YouTube is the most common means of accessing videos for students and Fortnite and Roblox are the most utilized gaming apps. Apps of concern that were mentioned by students include several in which they can connect with complete strangers, both via messaging and via video chats, which open up significant concerns with being exposed to or engaging in inappropriate and unsafe behaviors. Some of these apps that parents may want to be aware of include: Houseparty, Omegle, and Monkey, with Tellonym also mentioned, which can be an easy means of anonymous bullying. Inappropriate dating sites for youngsters (such as Tinder) and pornography websites (such as Pornhub) were also mentioned by middle schoolers as being used amongst their peer groups. A couple of great resources for parents to check out the latest trends and apps are www.commonsensemedia.org and www.connectsafely.org.

Tech Tip of the Month

Best Practice: Modeling Good Online Behavior

Our children watch us and copy what we do, even when we don't realize it (and even when they'd rather they didn't)! Here are a few things we can do to help raise kids who have a healthy relationship with the online world:

When you're posting online, pretend your kids will be reading it.

- Put down your phone while your kids are talking to you and during meals.
- Avoid posting or sharing derogatory or controversial content, particularly comments about other parents.
