

August BOE Report

The tax rate was approved and verified at \$4.0644 per \$100 assessed valuation. The Budget hearing was held in conjunction with the tax rate summary. The board voted to place \$3.4420 in fund 1 and .6224 cents in fund 4 capital improvements. The capital improvement levy generated will be used for the building and maintenance projects.

Thank you cards were read from Becky Reinig and Shelley Eaton.

The board readopted Financial Disclosure policy 0342 and policy 1110 Religious Expression. Mrs. Loucks was appointed custodian of records. Mr. Miles was appointed to be the Homeless/Migrant Coordinator as well as the English Limited Language Coordinator. The Local SPED Compliance Plan was approved as was the tuition rate of \$3500 per year. The board also approved the Federal Free/Reduced Lunch Policy.

The milk bid was awarded to Hiland Dairy and Graves was awarded the bread bid.

The board approved several ACES Cooperative contracts.

The board approved board policy 2871 deal with the medical marijuana law. This policy prohibits any employee other than a caregiver from administering medical marijuana to students and it would need to be administered at home when least likely to affect school behavior. Policy 4870 Drug Free Workplace, adds the prohibition of medical marijuana. Policy 5550 Food Service Program adds the non-discrimination language now mandated by the Department of Agriculture.

Ms. Flint reported MAP scores went out and this year's scores will be able to be compared to last year's. We will be looking at these scores closer at the next in-service. Mrs. Rother was awarded a \$500 grant from Missouri Retired Teacher's Association. Back to School Night was well attended. The Elementary Summer Reading Program Pool Party was also well attended and everyone had a great time. The beginning of the year assessments for math and reading will begin next week. The elementary and middle school student council fundraiser will start at the end of the month.

Mr. Miles mentioned eighty-nine students are enrolled in high school. Falls sports will begin with football versus Platte Valley here on August 30th. Volleyball begins September 3rd versus Nodaway Holt. Cross Country also runs the 3rd at North Platte. Teachers met to discuss the check and connect student program during back to school in-services.

Mr. Eaton reported on the progress of the press box and discussed the school board code of ethics policy 0340.

The board approved hiring Jaclyn Hale for the paraprofessional position.

The meeting adjourned at 7:24 p.m.
