Dear Parents/Guardians,

My name is Josh Walls and I am your student's Physical Education teacher. This will be my 4th year of teaching. I am a graduate of Iowa State University where I received my B.S. in K-12 Physical Education and Health with a minor in Coaching. I am also the 7th grade assistant football coach. I am looking forward to providing your child with an exciting and rewarding physical education program. The P. E. classes will prove to be an integral phase in their physical and social development. I take pride in our program and am committed to giving the students the best instruction possible.

The aim of the physical education program at Emerson Elementary School is **to develop and improve students' personal fitness and motor skills by providing developmentally appropriate activities through purposeful, creative, and enjoyable instruction**. By incorporating challenging yet achievable tasks, the students will attain positive attitudes about physical activity and movement.

Your child's locomotor movement, manipulative skills, personal behavior, and fitness level will be monitored and assessed throughout the school year. Every child is expected to participate to the best of their ability each day they attend class. There are days however, when illness or injury may inhibit your child's ability to participate. If so, please send a note with your child, with a brief description regarding the nature of the restriction. If the condition restricts activity for more than 5 consecutive days, a doctor's note will be requested.

We are concerned about your child's safety and for that reason; we ask that they wear athletic or running type shoes. Shoes with heals, boots or sandals (such as crocs) make it difficult for children to participate safely. We strongly encourage students to wear socks with their shoes and girls that choose to wear dresses or skirts should wear shorts underneath their clothing.

If your child has any ongoing health concerns or restrictions that we need to be aware of, please send a detailed note with instructions for their class participation limitations.

I will be posting pictures/videos throughout the school year on our Emerson Crusader facebook page, be sure to check them out and see what fun things we have going on.

Thank you for your support, and I look forward to working with your child in the upcoming 2019-20 school year.

ATTENDANCE

Daily attendance is critical for student learning. When families have a positive morning routine, children come to school on time, ready to develop relationships, able to learn new concepts, and apply their knowledge. Students should arrive to school between 7:45 - 7:55. If students arrive after the bell has rung, they will need to be escorted into the building/office. School hours are from 8:00 - 3:25

and 8:00 - 2:15 on early release Wednesdays. Supervision before school begins at 7:45. Students arriving before 7:45 need to report to the gym for breakfast. Any arrival after 8:00 will result in a tardy and require a slip to enter into class.

Students are not allowed to stand outside without supervision. After school supervision is provided for ten minutes after dismissal. Please make arrangements to have your child(ren) picked up on time.

If your child is sick or will be missing school, please call the office at 402-563-7030. If you need to leave a message, please share the following information:

If you would like homework collected, please let the office know. You may pick up homework in the office between 3:30 and 4:00.

Anytime you take your child out of school during the school day, you must come to the office and sign your child out. Your child will be called to the office when you arrive at school.



MEAL TIME

If kindergarten through fourth grade students would like to eat breakfast at school, serving times are from 7:25 – 7:45 each morning. Students should enter through the east doors and go directly to the gym. These doors are heavy so little ones may need adult help until they get use to the routine. Students attending breakfast will stay in the gym area until 7:45 when there is adult supervision for morning line up. All Kindergarten through fourth grade students will line up on the east slab. Preschool will line up on the southwest front slab. We do not serve breakfast or lunch to preschool students. However, if adult family members and younger siblings want to join an Emerson student for lunch, they can call the office to set that up. Lunches will need to be purchased as commercial foods are not permitted in the lunchroom.

We encourage you to pay for meals with a check; however, cash can be brought to the office where you can receive a receipt of payment. If students bring cash to school, we are not responsible for lost or stolen money. Free and Reduced lunch applications are available. Parents are encouraged to apply. Last year's free & reduced status expires on October 1st so a new form is required each year.





EMERSON SCHOOL PICTURES - Thursday, September 19th

A picture form with an attached envelope will be sent home with your child. If you wish to order school pictures: the envelope, with an enclosed check or cash, must be with your student on the day of pictures, Thursday September 19th, when the photographer is taking your student's picture. Checks will need to be made out to Interstate Studios. Each student will need to have their own envelope. You may also place your order online by following instructions on the order form.

EMERSON PTO

Please consider participating in our Emerson PTO. Meetings will be held quarterly. The first meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, September 17th at 5:00 in the Library. The first meeting will focus on our bylaws, Title I services, budget, staff gifts and upcoming family events. Input is important and new ideas are always appreciated. The PTO is a wonderful support to our school and the events that take place. Active membership in the PTO is vital for us to continue offering all of our family events, reading celebrations, field trips and teacher gifts to purchase items for the classrooms/students.

SAFETY REMINDERS

Please do not pick up or drop off students in the west parking lot. We ask that parents do not park in the west parking lot as this is a designated staff parking area. Please do not leave cars unattended in the fire lane. Crosswalks should always be used, please do not walk through the driving lane and between cars.

Please dress students appropriately for school. We ask that students wear tennis shoes as they have PE daily.

REMINDERS AT EMERSON

As part of our district's technology integration plan, we will continue to have all kindergarten through fourth grade students will be issued their own ipad device for school use. Students continue to learn how to use different tools throughout the school year. Students continue to learn how to use grade level appropriate Apps such as: Pages, Keynote, iMovie, Numbers, GarageBand, Nearpod, ClassKick, i-Nigma, Canva, Pic Collage, Educreations, Chatterpix, TouchCast Studio, Popplet, Epic!, Dojo and Google Suite.

School Board Policy 508.13 includes the following statement, "All foods offered on the school campus will meet or exceed the USDA Smart Snacks in School nutrition standards and/or state nutrition standards." The Smart Snacks in Schools applies to celebrations such as student birthdays. Due to this federal law and district policy, students are no longer allowed to bring food items to school when celebrating their birthday. In lieu of food items, students may bring party favors, pencils, erasers, etc. to share with classmates.



Birthday party invitations should not be distributed at school unless

they are given to all the boys and/or girls in the classroom. The school is not allowed to share student contact information, which includes home address and phone numbers. Gifts sent to students at school on birthdays or other occasions will be kept in the office and given to students at the end of the school day in order to minimize disruptions during instructional hours.

Most of our communication will be through phone messages, emails and our school website http://columbuspublicschools.org/emerson. Parents, please do not hesitate to call or ask questions. The first few weeks of school can be exciting for us all.

EMERSON EXPECTATIONS

Emerson students are expected to Be Safe, Be Respectful and Be Responsible. Our students are taught these skills through our expectation stations in the areas of; classrooms, cafeteria, playground, hallways, entryways, sidewalks, bathroom, arrival and dismissal areas, gym, stairs and health office. These general expectations help provide the students with a common understanding of our school rules. We will explicitly teach and positively reinforce these expectations throughout the school year.

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

Emerson has an amazing After School Program, which runs after school to 6:00 pm (6:15 pm on Wednesday). Our program supports the instructional day with homework support, peer helpers, reading buddies, computer skills and reading time. Our program also offers a variety of activity choices and clubs. If you are interested in enrolling your child in the Columbus After School Program, please call Stacey at 402-563-4901 or stop by their office located at 2715 13 th Street, Columbus, NE 68601. The after school program is supported in part by 21 st CCLC grant program which is Federal funds under Title IV, Part B of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act as amended. Fees are based on free/reduced/paid lunch status.

It is important to notify the After School Program at 402-276-6427, when your child will be absent from the program. This includes if your child leaves school due to illness.



CPS ACTIVITY CARDS

Parents and elementary students may purchase an activity card to attend home athletic & theater events. You may purchase activity cards at the High School office or any home athletic event. Student activity cards cost \$25. Adult activity cards cost \$100.

We are always thrilled to have "Little Discoverers" come to CHS sporting events. We expect all attendees to respect the game or activity, support participants, coaches & officials and model appropriate behavior. Just a reminder that students need to sit with parents or the adult who brought them. No students are allowed to run around unsupervised. They are not allowed to bring any type of balls to events.
