What will Cub Scouts do?

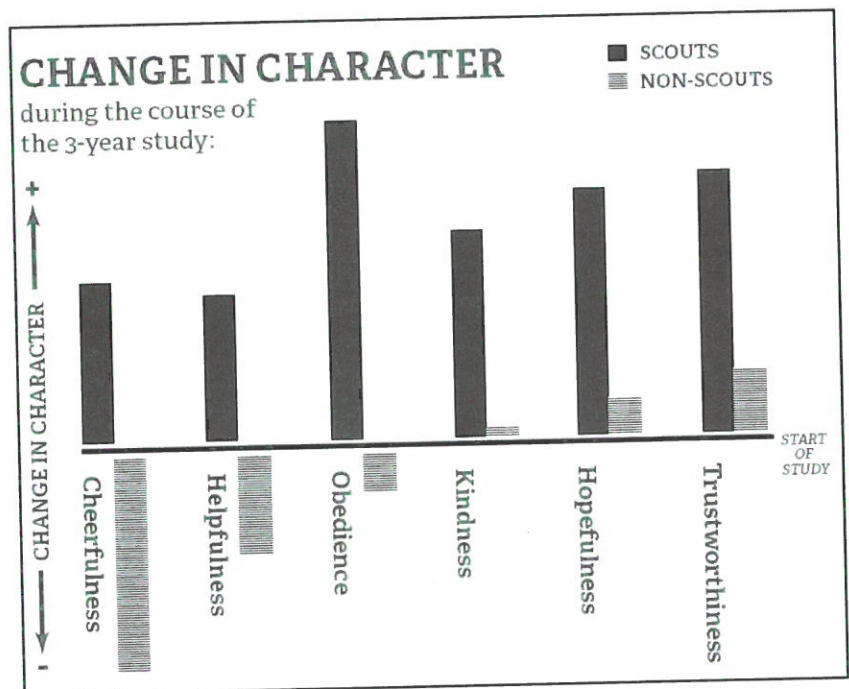
With their family and friends, Scouts complete age-specific activities that are rewarding, teach character and leadership skills and are FUN! These occur in meetings, on field trips and at home. Activities can include camping, fishing, hiking, swimming, STEM projects, archery, building and racing Pinewood Derby cars and more!

When will Cub Scouts meet?

Meeting days and times vary from Pack to Pack. Some meet once a week, others twice a month. Families can work together to choose a meeting schedule that is most convenient for the group.
