Summary of CDC Operational Strategies and Steps for Safe School Reopening


CDC recently released the [K-12 Operational Strategy](#) and a related [scientific brief](#) regarding schools. The CDC K-12 Operational Strategy makes recommendations based on the best-available evidence, which indicates that K-12 schools strictly implementing mitigation strategies can safely open for in-person instruction and remain open. The CDC K-12 Operational Strategy emphasizes the importance of using a combination of mitigation strategies to avoid COVID-19 transmission in schools, including:

1. Universal and correct wearing of [masks](#).
2. [Physical distancing](#).
3. [Handwashing](#) and [respiratory etiquette](#).
4. [Cleaning](#) and maintaining healthy facilities, including [ventilation improvements](#).
5. [Contact tracing](#) in combination with [isolation](#) and [quarantine](#), in collaboration with the State, local, territorial or Tribal health departments.

While each of these strategies is important, emphasis should be placed on the **universal and correct wearing of masks and physical distancing**.


In addition to these key mitigation strategies, screening testing¹ and prioritizing vaccinations for school staff can be layered as additional mitigation strategies to support reopening K-12 schools. However, screening testing and vaccinations are not prerequisites for safe reopening if students and staff consistently implement the mitigation strategies in the bulleted list above and described below. Schools can partner with local health departments to provide necessary testing to students and families, as appropriate, and in compliance with applicable privacy laws, including the Family

¹ Screening testing is intended to identify infected individuals without symptoms (or prior to development of symptoms) who may be contagious so that measures can be taken to prevent further transmission.





COVID-19 RETURN TO IN-PERSON LEARNING

- Students identified at all Buildings

Daily Self-Certification Procedures:

1. Parents will self-certify each student daily between 8:00 a.m. - 8:30 a.m. via App
2. Parents, do not allow your students to get on the bus or bring students to school if they are displaying COVID-19 symptoms. Also, contact the school regarding your students' symptoms and to report an absence.
3. Students will be temperature checked upon entering the building.

TO ENTER THE BUILDINGS



- Self-Certification
- Temperature of 100.4° or less
- Face Mask

COVID-19 Screening

- **Screening Protocol**

- Screen self before coming to school.
- Students must not come to school if they have COVID-19 symptoms or are lab-confirmed with COVID-19. Instead choose to opt to receive remote instruction.
 - Loss of taste or smell, cough, difficulty breathing, shortness of breath, fatigue, headache, chills, sore throat, congestion, or runny nose, shaking or exaggerated shivering, significant muscle pain or ache, diarrhea, or nausea and vomiting.
 - Have you been around anyone exhibiting these symptoms or who has tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 14 days?
- If COVID-19 is confirmed or exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms, follow the notification process for COVID-19.

Meals and Hand Washing



Breakfast/lunch

- Breakfast will be served in the classrooms.
- Lunch will be passed out to students as they leave the school building for transport back home.



Hand Washing/Sanitizing

- Students will be trained on appropriate hygiene practices.
- Wash hands frequently and use sanitizing stations responsibly.

Arrival and Dismissal

Arrival Time

- Early bird arrivals are strongly discouraged.
- Students will not be allowed inside the building
- Entry doors will be designated based on arrival method: bus riders, parent drop-off/walk to school, etc.
- Designated entry doors will be propped open for no touch entry. Any open doors will be continuously monitored by staff to stop unauthorized access and to monitor for threats.

Dismissal

- Parents with the ability to pick up students are encouraged to do so.
- Dismissal times will be staggered to limit the number of students in hallways and exit at any given time.
- Sanitizer stations will be placed at each exit and students will be encouraged to sanitize hands prior to exit.
- Parents picking up students will wait in their car until his/her student arrives to the vehicle

Restrooms and Face Coverings (Masks)

Restrooms

- Limit the number of occupants utilizing each restroom.
- Students will have scheduled bathroom breaks.
- Clean and sanitize restrooms every hour.
- Signage displaying handwashing techniques

Protocols for Face Coverings

- Students will wear face coverings in hallways, common areas, while riding the bus to and from school and during arrival and dismissal, and in the classroom.
- Students' individual needs will be addressed on a case-by-case basis.
- Repeated requests to keep masks on will result in remote learning for the remainder of quarter four.

Procedures

Check-out Procedures

- Parents call ahead of time to schedule a pickup and answer qualifying over the phone.
- Parent/Guardian email the attendance office from the email address that is on file to schedule a time for pickup. Email must include a photocopy of ID.
- Verification call made for permission/authorization of pickup.

Morning Entry

- Enter assigned entry door with facial covering
- Patiently Stand six feet apart
- Get temperature checked
- Sanitize hands
- Go directly to designated area
- If exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms go directly to the nurse's office

Transition

- Students and staff will follow protocols for face coverings/masks.
- Staggered releases from each class will be organized to limit the number of students in the hallway during transitions.
- Traffic patterns will be established throughout the campus
- When possible, one-way traffic throughout campus corridors will be established

Classroom Expectations and Isolation Protocols

Classroom Expectations

- Students will wear face coverings in class.
- Students will sit in assigned seating daily to assist with contact tracing.
- Students will socially distance as much as possible in class.
- Bring technology daily!
- Communal supplies will be limited.

Isolation Protocols-Displaying COVID-19 Symptoms

- Students displaying symptoms of COVID-19 will be escorted to the nurse's office
- Parent will be notified to pick up student within 30 minutes and no more than an hour from the time the campus contacted the student's parent/guardian
- Other students will be removed from the classroom if needed and taken to an alternate location so the classroom can be disinfected.
- District communication will be provided to the parents of students.
- **Students and staff who have tested positive for COVID-19 will be required to submit a letter of good health from a physician's office and a negative COVID-19 test prior to returning to school.**
