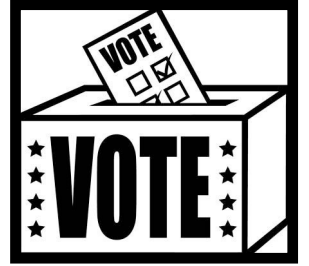

School Health Reminders:

*All students in PreK/Kindergarten, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, and 11th grades, and new entrants to the district are required to have a current physical on file at school. Physicals need to be dated no more than 12 months prior to the start of the school year in which they are required, or the date of entrance to school for new entrants. Physicals are required annually for students to be eligible to participate in interscholastic athletics.

*Vaccines required for Pre-K/K and school attendance:

Diphtheria and Tetanus toxoid-containing vaccine and Pertussis vaccine (DTaP or Tdap)

Hepatitis B vaccine

Measles, Mumps and Rubella vaccine (MMR)

Polio vaccine

Varicella (Chickenpox) vaccine

Haemophilus influenzae type b conjugate vaccine (HiB)

Pneumococcal Conjugate vaccine (PCV)

*Additional vaccines required for middle school and high school:

Tdap vaccine adolescent booster for 6th grade

Meningococcal conjugate vaccine for 7th grade and 12

Please note students must be up to date with vaccines within 14 days of the first day of school to continue to attend.

Please call your healthcare provider, or Lewis County Public Health at 315-376-5453, to make sure your child meets all physical and immunization requirements to attend school. Schedule physicals and immunization boosters during the summer, and have copies sent to school, to ensure your child is all set for the fall.

HIGH SCHOOL COUNSELING INFORMATION

SENIORS:

If you are planning to attend college in the fall, we strongly encourage you to attend any summer orientation programs offered by the college/university. This will make the transition in the fall much easier.

If you are still looking for employment, you can contact The Workplace at 315-376-5800 or email lewisonestop@dfa.state.ny.gov for information about available local jobs. This service is available to anyone.

JUNIORS:

If you are planning to participate in college athletics at the Division I or II level, you need to begin the registration process with the NCAA at this time. If you have questions, please see your school counselor or your coach. Please register online at www.eligibilitycenter.org.

If you are considering ROTC scholarships (military) or applying to any of the service academies, you should go online now, contact your school counselor, and begin the admissions process immediately.

College visits should happen this spring and summer. Call or email the college's admissions office to set up an appointment and check the college websites for open house dates. Contact Mrs. Birmingham or Ms. Green if you need assistance.

ACT and SAT: If you missed the spring tests, please check the websites for summer and fall tests. Remember, you must register online, ahead of time at www.actstudent.org and www.collegeboard.org.

MITCHELL DOMAGALA AND DUBLIN MOORE were selected to represent South Lewis at 2022 Boys' State. The Lowville American Legion sponsors our students at this event. Candidates have the opportunity to learn the privileges and responsibilities of citizenship in a democratic society. They also participate in rallies, speeches, campaigns and work with legislative committees to create bills.

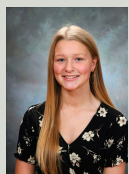


EMMA REID was selected to receive the Clarkson University Leadership Award. This award is the highest honor at Clarkson University. This award recognizes strong leadership qualities, positive impact on South Lewis High School and the local community, and a proven academic record.

CLAYTON KRAEGER was awarded the Clarkson University Achievement Award. This award is presented to a junior who has an academic interest in engineering, business, science or liberal arts, is enrolled in college preparation courses, and has achieved academic success.



ALYSSA CALLAGHAN, OLIVIA MILLARD, DUBLIN MOORE, SARAH SCHINDLER AND ASHLEY WRIGHT have been selected for the Keuka College George H. Ball Community Achievement Award. 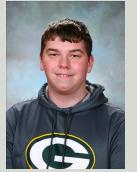
