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A Look At Title I

North Brooks Elementary School (NBES) is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

What is Our Plan For Shared Student Achievement?

This is a plan that describes how the administratos and staff of NBES will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. NBES values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that NBES will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

A survey is shared with parents to collect information to assist in the review and revision of this parent and family engagement policy, the annual school improvement plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget for NBES. Parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year via our parent engagement coordinator. Our plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the following school year. Parents and family members can also give feedback during the various parent meetings and activities hosted by our parent engagement coordinator during the school year including our district's annual Lend Your Voice event.

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. NBES will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

At the beginning of the year, a hard copy of the plan is distributed to all students. The plan is also disseminated via email and text using our Trojan app, posted on the school website and social media, and a hard copy can be retrieved from the Parent Resource Room at NBES.

2023-2024 Brooks County School District Goals

- Goal 1: The Brooks County School District will increase the number of students scoring Developing or higher by 3% as measured by the Spring 23 End of Grade and End of Course Georgia Milestones Assessment System.
- Goal 2: Brooks County School District will improve areas of the climate rating by 3% through the implementation of targeted resources and interventions.

2023-2024 NBES School Improvement Goals

- NBES will increase by 3% the percentage of 3rd, 4th, & 5th students meeting the state grade level Lexile target, as measured by the Reading section of the 2024 Georgia Milestones Assessment.
- NBES will increase by 3% the percentage of 3rd, 4th, & 5th grade students scoring achievement levels 3 and 4 (Proficient and Above) on the Math section of the 2024 Georgia Milestones Assessment.
- NBES students in grades K-2 will increase in reading and math achievement by 3% from August 2023 to May 2024, as measured by district-approved math and reading diagnostic assessments.
- NBES will increase by 3% the number of students who miss less than 10% of the days enrolled at NBES.

NBES is committed to helping our parents and families attend the family activities listed in this policy. Please call or email us if you need assistance with child care or transportation in order to participate in our programs.


