## District Goals

- <u>RTI</u> We have seen good growth from schools that have implemented RTI with diligence. We want to develop a strong RTI program in all grades and subjects all the way through 12th grade. We have two schools that did school wide training on RTI and look to have more trained. We want to have an effective RTI program in place district wide.
- <u>PLC</u> A true PLC focuses on 4 questions. 1. What are the students supposed to know (essential standards)? 2. How do we know they have learned the standard? 3. What do we do if they have not learned the standard? 4. What do we do if they have learned the standard? We have three schools in the district that are going through extensive training on the PLC model and many administrators going to PLC Institutes. With the training and knowledge gained we plan to move the entire district towards having true PLC's and not just grade level meetings or subject level meetings. PLC's when done effectively have been proven to bring teachers together as a team and move student progress.
- <u>Essential Standards</u> ES are the non-negotiable standards that students absolutely must learn to move forward. These standards are the ones that are discussed in PLC's and are the standards most teaching focuses around. The ES's are also what RTI is based on. It is our goal that we have all ES's in place by the end of the school year but preferably much sooner. True PLC's and true RTI can not take place without them.





## Summer School

• 134 El Dorado District K-2 students attended summer school during the 2019 session. Average Daily Attendance was right at 100. The 6-week summer school focused on foundational reading skills. Students rotated through four sessions daily and were taught by 8 different highly qualified teachers! Out of the 100 tested, 70 showed growth and 25 of those actually reached grade-level reading expectations! In addition, all students grew socially and emotionally-There were no suspensions during summer school.



## Summer School AR Reading

- For the first time, El Dorado School District also opened the Accelerated Reading Lab to elementary students. Students going into grades 1-4 could take as many AR tests as they desired. Members of the El Dorado Football team, El Dorado Police Department, Barton Cheerleaders, UCAPS, El Dorado's Literacy Team, and Reeves Robinson, greeted and encouraged these young readers. Students participating in summer learning programs at St. Johns, Boys and Girls Club, and Take 5 brought vans full of students to the AR lab.
- Karla Nelson from the Barton Library, located across the street from Hugh Goodwin, acknowledged that our summer reading initiative also increased student visits at their library and their summer story times. (5,652 children's books were checked out during the summer school period from Barton Library!).
