II. Approval of Agenda

Tina Dombroski moved, seconded by Anne Mitchell and carried unanimously to approve the Agenda for the Business Meeting of February 9, 2009.

III. Accolades

The faculty at Scott M. Ellis Elementary School thanked the Greenville Rotarians for their generous donation of dictionaries. Each year third grade students are given a dictionary by the Rotary Club of Greenville. The dictionaries are a valuable tool that will be well used by students for years to come. Also thanked were Robin Frechette and Wells Packard for personally presenting the dictionaries to the third graders.

Peter Mahan Elementary Principal introduced faculty members, Kathleen Nelson and Pamela Hollinde, to the Board of Education to present information on the elementary technology program. The first project presented by Kathleen Nelson engaged students in sharing holiday greetings with students from across the United States. Highlights included:

- Goal #1 provided students with access to a variety of resources which enable them to be critical thinkers and develop skills for their future study and employment.
- Goal #2 was to increase the student's ability to achieve, communicate, and plan in the digital community.
- Student used digital media and environments to communicate and work collaboratively.
- Students used Google Maps for a map of Greenville and Google Earth to research the towns they were communicating with.

The second project presented by Pamela Hollinde engaged first and second grade students in an interdisciplinary study of maps and communities. Students had to define what a community is and identify the basic needs of a community. They drew "birds-eye view" maps of their community. Students will understand the relationships and common themes that connect mathematics, science, and technology and apply the themes to these and other areas of learning.

Grades K – 6 \$6,612.00 Grades 7 – 12 \$7,477.00

Special Education:

Grades K – 6 \$23,640.00 Grades 7 – 12 \$24,505.00

(The estimated tuition rates are based on a formula defined in §174.2 of the Regulations of the Commissioner. In previous years the formula used allowed for two rates for Special Education students depending on the level of service. Under the new foundation aid, the formula only allows for one rate. Since we are a "closed" campus, these rates are for the students that have been grandfathered, as well as for foster students. The cost for foster students is charged back to the district that the child attended before being placed in foster care.)

2. Award surplus bids (FY2009-47)

(Bids were opened in the District Office on Wednesday, January 14, 2009. There were two [2] bidders, one of whom is ineligible as an employee of the district according to Board of Education Policy #4.310. B. Saturday, January 31 Workshop

Three towns were represented at the Workshop on Saturday, January 31, 2009: Greenville, Rensselaerville and New Baltimore. Perspectives on each town's long range plans were discussed. Ideas were shared on preserving rural character while also encouraging new business and growth. Board of Education members were enthusiastic on keeping lines of communication open with all eleven towns that comprise the District and continuing this Workshop in the future.
