Evaluation Considerations

Academic

This assessment measures achievement and identifies strengths and weaknesses in pre-academic skills, math, reading, and written language.

Intellectual/Adaptive Behavior Evaluates overall intellectual functioning and potential, self-help, and social skills.

Perceptual and Motor

May include assessments in sensory and motor development, functional oral skills, muscular development, daily living skills, and adaptive equipment needs.

Social and Emotional

This is an evaluation of social adjustment and interaction with the educational environment.

Speech and Language

Assesses the ability to communicate within one's environment. Areas of evaluation may include articulation, receptive/expressive language, fluency, and voice.

Other

A review of hearing, vision and/or medical records, or outside evaluations may be included.
