Caldwell High School is one of two public high schools in Noble County and the only high school in the Caldwell Exempted Village School District. It is a public high school with an enrollment of 238 students in grades 9-12. There are 65 juniors and seniors who attend the Mid-East Career & Technology Center. The academic year is divided into two semesters; four nine-week grading periods.

Located in the Appalachian region of Noble County, Caldwell is situated off Interstate 77 about 100 miles southeast of Columbus, the state capital. The district serves approximately 1050 students.

CURRICULUM

Caldwell High School offers a broad and varied academic curriculum. All English courses at Caldwell are considered college preparatory as of the 2019-2020 school year. Caldwell High School, in partnership with Zane State College and Washington State Community College, offers ten College Credit Plus (CCP) courses taught by our faculty on our campus. Students also have the option to participate in the CCP program on college campuses.

Three CTE pathways are offered to students: Agriculture, Computer-Aided Drafting (CAD), and Art.

CCP Course Options: Composition 1, Composition 2, American Literature, British Literature, Environmental Biology, Introduction to Ethics, Principles of Reasoning, 2-Dimensional Design, Drawing I, Painting I, Digital Photography.

CLASS RANK

Rank in class is exact and computed each semester, on an unweighted scale. Rank is cumulative and is reported on the transcript. Fifty-seven percent of the class of 2019 has a GPA of 3.0 and above.
