



ADHD - Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder



er – perfect, fern, germ, nerve

oa – oak, soap, toast, coach
oi – oil, join, noise, moisture
or – orbit, short, before, for
ou – out, house, round, mountain
ow – (o sound) own, bowl, snowball, yellow
ow – (ow sound) brown, plow, owl, allow
oy – boy, joyful, enjoy, destroy
ur – urn, purple, church, fur

Help your student notice the vowel teams while reading familiar words and encourage them to look for vowel teams (and the consonant clusters from last weeks newsletter) when reading unfamiliar words to help figure out the new word.
