We have provided some simple directions for our first elearning day. If you have any other questions, please contact your student's school office.

Directions for elearning day:

- Students will access assignments on Schoology. Each teacher has prepared a folder labeled elearning day (Day 1- Oct. 18th).
- Teachers may be contacted via email (or other means that the teacher has shared) between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. on elearning days. You may contact your student's school office during this time as well.
- Students will have two days to turn in completed eLearning assignments. For example, all work from October 18th would be due no later than October 22nd.
- Attendance will be tracked by handing in completed work. If work is not handed in or submitted by the due date, it will count as an unexcused absence.

We are thrilled to offer the opportunity of an elearning program to our Warrior students.
