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### Our Path Topic

An area of growing concern in any organization, or at home for that matter, is cybersecurity. As WASD continues to develop technologically, we need to consider our cybersecurity methods and approach. This seems like a good topic to explore the next week or two.

Let's look first at our key organizational characteristics when examining cybersecurity. First, organizational environment. What are our organization's main product and service offerings? We offer teaching and learning, student support services, extracurricular activities and much more. In education, we do offer much technology. We have Access4All at the middle school, and a great deal of technology at the other schools; almost to the point of one to one devices. So, how is technology relative to our success as an organization? Access4All is providing our students with improved communication, better access to educational resources and materials, and an opportunity to gain more technology skills. What mechanisms do we use to deliver our products and services? We use Chromebooks and other technology throughout the District that provides our students with the tools to learn, and our employees to be supported in completing their jobs efficiently and effectively.

Our mission is to educate and empower students for future success. Clearly, our students are gaining more technology skills that will help them develop more skills for their future success. The technology can help students with thinking critically, problem solving, and connecting school to career. A WASD value is the use of emerging technology. So, that is a clear connection to our mission, vision, and values.

Another area of importance is a growing knowledge and skill set of our employees. Our WASD Team must be able to continue to develop our skills in understanding technology use and security. We need to keep up with current issues, software, and trends in cybersecurity to protect our students, staff, and resources. Keeping in tune with our workforce and cybersecurity workforce employee groups and segments and the key drivers that engage them in accomplishing their work, including cybersecurity related work, and in achieving our mission and vision are important areas to consider.

WASD must maintain our major physical and virtual assets, including data, knowledge, devices, systems, facilities, and equipment used. In addition, we need to prioritize for protecting these assets, based on their criticality and value.

Knowing the key laws and regulations relating to cybersecurity in education and the District is also critical. We need to know safety regulations relating to cybersecurity, accreditation, certification, or registration requirements, industry standards and environmental, financial, and product regulations relating to cybersecurity.

As we look at cybersecurity, we must consider our organizational structure, customers and stakeholders, suppliers and partners, competitive environment, strategic context, and performance improvement

system. Over time, these are the areas we must examine and address to develop a world class and secured cyber program.
