Our Path Topic

As mentioned last week, it is always good to review best practices. Here is another that is certainly a good thing to keep in mind when working on a project or goal.

We have looked at a performance excellence tool called ADLI. Another is LeTCI. This one is a device to use to look at Results of data one collects. LeTCI stands for

Levels/Trends/Comparisons/Integration. This is a device we have looked at a couple times. However, it is a best practice that needs repeated and revisited often. To achieve our vision of *First Choice* LeTCI is critical to our success. Anyone can use LeTCI and help one's project be more successful. Here is how it works.

Once you determine you have an objective/goal, and a project, follow LeTCI.

 \checkmark Levels—what levels do our data show? It is numerical information that places or positions your organization's results and performance on a meaningful measurement scale. Performance levels permit evaluation relative to past performance, projections, goals, and appropriate comparisons.

 \checkmark **Trends**—what trends do our data show? Trends are numerical information that show the exhibiting the use of data and information so that learning is possible. Approaches are systematic if they build in the opportunity for evaluation, improvement, and sharing, thereby permitting a gain in maturity.

✓ **Comparisons**—this is a tool used to compare internally and externally of the organization. Internally, an organization can compare grade levels, departments, schools, year to year, and so on. Externally, a school district can compare data to other school districts in the county, intermediate unit, state, country, or the world. One can compare similar school districts, or just compare to the best schools or programs in the area, state or country. Comparisons give the organization a measuring stick that shows how well a school or program is doing compared to another school or program.

✓ **Integration**—This is the harmonization of plans, processes, information, resource decisions, workforce capability and capacity, actions, results, and analyses to support key organization-wide goals. Effective integration goes beyond alignment and is achieved when the individual components of an organizational performance management system operate as fully interconnected unit.

LeTCI is also another oldie, but goodie. It is a tool, and it never wears. It is a tool for looking at data and results, and can be used for evaluating process. It is a quantitative way to determine the success of a process or plan. This tool may be used to improve what we do individually in our jobs and an organization.
