Our Path to First Choice No.20 2018/19

Everyone,

Winter has arrived! It is pretty cold this week. Maybe not as bad as last year at this time, but it is cold. Hopefully the Path Note this week will warm you up to a good toasty temperature.

Our Path Topic

This week's Path Note is just a quick overview of where the *First Choice* team is currently at in the process. The team is using a Google Doc to collect information from its team members and any of you willing to share with them (send to Mike Bercaw, Tom Hoffman, and Cathy Beatty). The information they are seeking is "what are we currently doing toward *First Choice* now?"

So far, they have gathered that we do have a Pre-kindergarten educational program that is just getting started in the district (Pre-Elementary). We have Franklin County Career and Technical School Field Trip, Project Team, and comprehensive kindergarten which are all contributing towards building the *First Choice* for our students. At the Middle Level, we have Adventures in Careers, Adventures in Learning, High School Credit for particular classes, and FBLA (field trips—i.e., Grove-Bowersox). Finally, we have Franklin County Career and Technical School option for students, Career Cruising (Career Counselor/College Counselor), Freshman Seminar, Child Development Class, ASVAB, Individualized Career Based Intro to Business, Big Chief's School Store, PSAT/SAT, FBLA, In-class discussions (ex. Careers in science), and Guest speakers and seminars (ex. Science, social studies dept).

There is much more that WASD is doing to lead to a student's *First Choice*. If you know of other activities or programs, please make sure that the *First Choice Team* receives the items. The team has dozens of representatives from elementary, middle and high school; including, members of the community and parents.

Once the team develops the list of what we are already doing, they will develop a *gap analysis* to determine what we do not offer, but need to include. In addition, the team will develop a system and processes that will provide each student the same opportunities as anyone. Right now, we have numerous great things happening, but not all students have the same opportunities. *First Choice* will have broad activities and programs in the elementary schools to provide career exposure to students. In the middle school, it will begin to divide into pathways for more hands-on opportunities and activities in order to help students begin to find a strength or interest in a particular pathway. By high school, we need to start narrowing down a student's path and choice. However, many students will not have a choice, so we must provide them with various opportunities to assist in making a career choice or general pathway.

During a student's senior year (unless he/she graduates early), he/she may choose to take college courses or other post-secondary educational opportunities, do an internship or more, participating in a job experience through one or more jobs in the community, or any other activity that will help the student meet the requirements of his/her *First Choice* by graduation.

Good organizations use various tools to measure its effectiveness and look at how to improve. One tool is the use of surveys. Conducting surveys is an unbiased (or should be) approach to decision-making. We should not rely on "gut feelings" to make important decisions. We can collect unbiased survey data and develop decisions based on analyzed results.
